Currently it is saturated in water and adding loads of gravel and rocks have done nothing to fix the problem. It was the consensus of the Board that this is not a county section line road and has not been annexed into the city to become a city street. It was the consensus of the Board that this is a township issue and they should get together with the Vermillion Township Board.

At 6:40 P.M. the Board adjourned as County Commissioners and convened as Joint Ditch Board in the Public Safety Center (basement of the Courthouse).

SDDOT Paul Nikolas/Design Engineer and Ron Peterson/Engineer were present to discuss the Hwy50 road project and their request for drainage into existing county drainage ditches. The new proposal will drain in Highway right-of-way from 455 Ave on the north side of Hwy 50 to approximately 457 Ave. crossing over to the South side of Hwy 50 east/southeast of Meckling to the Vermillion River.
