Council Special Session
April 18, 2011
Monday 12:00 noon**

The special session of the City Council, City of Vermillion, South Dakota was held on Mon-day, April 18, 2011 at 12:00 noon in the City Hall large conference room.

1. Roll Call
Present: Grayson, Meins, Willson, Zimmerman, Mayor Powell

2. Educational Session - Electric Rate Study - Missouri River Energy Services

John Prescott, City Manager, reported that the last electric rate study was completed in 2004 and with the completion of the transmission line it was time to again review that our rate structure was recovering the costs of providing service to each customer class. John noted that it appears that our purchase of power rates may be leveling off for the next 3 to 4 years which is a welcome change from the past few years with annual rate increases. John introduced Tim Miller, Manager, Financial Analysis & Rates, of Missouri River Energy Services to review the rate study.

Tim Miller reviewed some of the major changes since the last rate study noting that power costs have nearly doubled since 2003, the City has issued debt to construct the transmission line and the large commercial class usage has increased about 50% since 2003. As to the purchase of power costs, Tim reported that there are no rate increases proposed for WAPA for 2011 through 2015 and that MRES has adopted seasonal rates that are being phased in from 2011 through 2013. The seasonal rates are to better reflect the MRES costs of supplying the power noting that power costs are more expensive in the summer and winter months thus the rates are higher in those months. This rate will also encourage members to implement load management systems like Vermillion has already put in place. Tim reviewed the assumptions used in projecting future operating expenses. Based upon these assumptions, a rate increase of 2.2% is needed to meet the expenses and maintain acceptable reserves.

Tim reviewed the cost of service results with the recommendation of a 2.2% increase in June 2011 and the implementation of the seasonal rates in January 2012. The seasonal rate will be increased rates for billing in July, August and September with lower rates for the other nine months.

Tim reviewed the rates as proposed for June 2011 with residential having a \$1 per month increase in customer charge and the energy charge remaining the same. Small commercial will have a \$1.50 per month increase in single phase customer charge with the energy charge remaining the same. Large commercial will see a \$3.00 per month increase in customer charge with a \$.80 increase in the demand charge with the energy charge remaining the same.

The seasonal rates proposed for January 2012 would have the residential energy charge go from \$.0885 per kwh to \$.087 per kwh for January to June billing then increase to \$.092 per kwh for July through September billing then back down to \$.087 per kwh for October to December. For small commercial the seasonal proposed rate for January 2012 would change the energy charge from \$.0925 per kwh to \$.091 per kwh for January to June billing then increase to \$.096 per kwh for July through September billing then back down to \$.091 per kwh for October to December. The large commercial energy charge will remain the same but the demand charge for January 2012 would change from \$11.85 per kwh to \$11.30 per kwh for January to June billing then increase to \$13.30 per kwh for July through September billing then back down to \$11.30 per kwh for October to December. Tim noted that the proposed rates would cover increasing operating expenses and pay for the necessary system improvements, would allow the utility to remain financially strong with cash reserves remaining relatively stable and would reflect the change in wholesale power costs.

Tim answered questions of the City Council on the proposed rates noting that they would remain the same through 2015 unless there is a change in the purchase of power costs. Discussion followed noting the need to develop educational information to explain the seasonal rates that will take effect in January 2012.

3. Briefing on the April 18, 2011 City Council Regular Meeting Agenda
Council reviewed items on the agenda with City staff. No action was taken.

The new regulations have been reviewed and recommended for approval by the Planning Commission and the proposed ordinance was reviewed by the County Commission. Jose re-viewed the minor and major platting requirements. Discussion followed with Jose answering questions of the City Council.
