Application No. 7297-3 proposes to appropriate 1.11 cfs from one well to be completed into the Missouri:Elk Point Aquifer (100 feet deep) located in SW 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 15 for irrigation of 80 acres located in the W 1/2 NW 1/4 Section 15; all in T92N-R52W.

Application No. 7298-3 proposes to appropriate 2.28 cfs from one well to be completed into the Missouri:Elk Point Aquifer (175 feet deep) located in the center of the NE 1/4 Section 26 to irrigate 160 acres located in the NE 1/4 Section 26; all in T92N-R51W.

Application No. 7299-3 proposes to irrigate an additional 38 acres and specify the location of wells. Water Right No. 977A-3 appropriates 3.64 cfs from two wells completed into the Missouri:Elk Point Aquifer to irrigate 255 acres located in the SE 1/4 Section 28 and the E 1/2 SE 1/4, SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 33; all in T92N-R51W. This application seeks to authorize the location of the wells currently used by Water Right No. 977A-3 and proposed to be used by Application No. 7299-3 as being located near the center of the SE 1/4 Section 28 and near the center of the SE 1/4 Section 33, T92N, R51W. This application also proposes to irrigate 38 additional acres located in the NW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 33 which will allow the pivot in this quarter section to make a full rotation. This application, if approved, does not authorize any increase in the developed diversion rate from the existing well.

Application No. 7300-3 proposes to irrigate an additional 10 acres. Water Permit No. 6059-3 appropriates 1.84 cfs from two wells completed into the Missouri:Elk Point Aquifer to irrigate 129 acres located in the NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SE 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 25-T92N-R52W and W 1/2 SW 1/4, SW 1/4 NW 1/4 Section 30-T92N-R51W. This application proposes to irrigate an additional 10 acres located in the Island Farm addition in Section 11 and 12, T32N, R04E, Vermillion Township. This application, if approved does not increase the diversion rate authorized by Water Right No. 6059-3.

Application No. 7301-3 proposes to irrigate an additional 32 acres. Water Right No. 6679-3 appropriates 2.23 cfs from one well completed into the Missouri:Elk Point Aquifer to irrigate 140 acres located in the SE 1/4, E 1/2 SW 1/4 Section 30 and NW 1/4 SW 1/4 Section 29; all in T92N-R51W. This applications proposes to irrigate an additional 32 acres located in the Island Farm addition in Section 11 and 12, and Parcel B of Lot 1 Section 12; and E 1/2 Lot 1 Section 13; all in T32N, R04E, Vermillion Township. This application, if approved, does not increase the diversion rate authorized by Water Right No. 6679-3.

Application No. 7302-3 proposes to appropriate 1.64 cfs from one well completed into the Missouri:Elk Point Aquifer located in the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 32-T92N-R51W to irrigate 115 acres located in the Accretion to Section 24 lying E & S of Lot 1 to Section line 24, T32N, R04E, Vermillion Township.

Pursuant to SDCL 46-2A-2, the Chief Engineer recommends APPROVAL of each of the above Applications because 1) unappropriated water is available, 2) existing rights will not be unlawfully impaired, 3) it is a beneficial use of water, and 4) it is in the public interest. In accordance with SDCL 46-2A-23, the Chief Engineer will act on these applications, as recommended, unless a petition is filed opposing the applications or the applicant files a petition contesting the Chief Engineer's recommendations. If a petition opposing the applications or contesting the recommendations is filed, then a hearing will be scheduled and the Water Management Board will consider these applications. Notice of the hearing will be given to the applicant and any person filing a petition.

Any person interested in opposing or supporting these applications or recommendations must file a written petition with BOTH the applicant and Chief Engineer. The applicant must file a petition if contesting the Chief Engineer's recommendations. The Chief Engineer's address is "Water Rights Program, Foss Building, 523 E Capitol, Pierre SD 57501 (605 773-3352)" and the applicant's mailing address is given above. A petition filed by either an interested person or the applicant must be filed by April 30, 2012.

The petition may be informal, but must include a statement describing the petitioner's interest in the applications, the petitioner's reasons for opposing or supporting the applications, and the signature and mailing address of the petitioner or the petitioner's legal counsel, if legal counsel is obtained. USD Opera bridges departments, merges talent for 'Dido & Aeneas'

The University of South Dakota Opera will present a modern adaptation of the operatic masterpiece "Dido and Aeneas" at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, April 28, at Aalfs Auditorium inside Slagle Hall.

"Dido and Aeneas," presented by the USD Opera in conjunction with the USD Theatre, USD Chamber Singers and USD Chamber Orchestra, features a mythic queen, her lover and an evil sorceress bent on revenge.

"This opera is our largest-scale production to date," noted USD opera director Tracelyn Gesteland, D.M.A., assistant professor of music-voice/opera. "Modern audiences will enjoy our updated adaptation of Henry Purcell's classic dramatic masterpiece. This production relays the story of the opera not

only with beautiful singing, but also through the use of ballet and modern dance to enhance the narrative."

The plot begins as young Queen Dido of Carthage, played by Natalie Campbell of Sioux Falls, mourns her late husband and is pursued by the Trojan Prince, Aeneas, played by Cody Perk of Yankton. In wooing Dido, Aeneas spurns the affections of the Sorceress, played by Laura Kuschel of St. Paul, resulting in dire consequences.

With choreography by sophomore music major Rebecca Hebda of Yankton, the opera also features Marissa Morris from Rapid City as Ballet Dido, Kenneth Granle from Mantorville, MN, as Ballet Aeneas, and Chaya Gordon-Bland, assistant professor of

theatre, in the role of Ballet Sorceress.

In addition to combining the forces of voice and dance, USD Opera is blazing forward in new partnerships with the USD Chamber Orchestra under the direction of Marie-Elaine Gagnon, D.M.A., and Eunho Kim, D.M.A., both assistant professors of music at USD, as well as the USD Chamber Singers, directed by David Holdhusen, Ph.D., assistant professor of music.

In addition to preparing the Chamber Singers to serve as the opera chorus, Holdhusen will also conduct the orchestra for this performance. The production will also feature scenic elements created by the USD Theatre Department.

"The collaboration between

USD Opera, the Chamber Singers and the Chamber Orchestra is an excellent opportunity to provide useful and invaluable experience to the student musicians within each ensemble," added Gesteland.

General admission tickets for "Dido & Aeneas" will be sold at the door (\$10 adults/\$5 students with I.D.). The hour-long opera is performed in English and includes supertitles for ease-of-understanding. The production also contains mature themes that are not intended for children.

Sebesta recipient of Doyle Humanities Teaching Award

Judith Lynn Sebesta, Ph.D., professor of classics and chair of the department of history at the University of South Dakota, is the 2012 recipient of the Monsignor James Doyle Humanities Teaching Award.

Presented by the College of Arts and Sciences at USD, Sebesta was honored with the award and \$500 at the 2012 Phi Beta Kappa initiation/Lifto Amundson Lecture on March 29.

Sebesta is co-editor of "The World of Roman Costume" (University of Wisconsin Press) and co-author of "The Worlds of Roman Women" (Focus Press). She is co-editor of The On-line Companion to the Worlds of Roman Women (www2.cn.edu/home/sas/araia/companion.html), executive secretary of the National

Committee for Latin and Greek (www.promotelatin.org) and is noted for her expertise in Latin teaching methodology.

She has taught courses in Latin, classical mythology, ancient Egypt and women in antiquity, and her research interests include Women in Antiquity, particularly Roman women, and Roman clothing and costumes. Sebesta received her Ph.D. from Stanford University and a B.A. from the University of Chicago.

Made possible thanks to a gift from Monsignor James Michael Doyle, former chair of religious studies at USD and a prominent theologian inducted into the South Dakota Hall of Fame, the Doyle Award is awarded annually to an outstanding teacher in the Humanities Division of the College of Arts and Sciences.
