Coyote football changes game times

Four home games rescheduled for S.D. high school championships

University of South Dakota Director of Athletics David Sayler announced Tuesday that the game times for the four home games in the DakotaDome will kick-off at 2 p.m., with the exception of the Northern Iowa game on Nov. 10 (noon) due to the South Dakota high school football championships in the DakotaDome.

The season begins with the trip to Montana on Sept. 1 at 2:30 p.m. CST. The Coyotes then return home to host Colgate in the Hall of Fame game at 2 p.m., Sept. 8 in the DakotaDome. After the bye week, the Coyotes travel to Big Ten Conference member Northwestern on Sept. 22 with the time of that game still to be determined by the Big Ten Network.

"We feel moving our regular kick time to 2 p.m. makes sense both from an attendance and gameday standpoint," Sayler said. "Coyote fans now will be able to tailgate in Coyote Tailgate Nation from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. prior to kickoff, and then enjoy all Vermillion has to offer following the games."

Following the Northwestern game, South Dakota begins its first season in the Missouri Valley Football Conference with a pair of home games at 2 p.m., beginning Sept. 29 with Illinois State, followed by an Oct. 6 matchup with Western Illinois for DakotaDays. From there, the Coyotes travel to Missouri State on Oct. 13 for a 1 p.m. start.

The Coyotes then host defending FCS (Football Championship Subdivision) National Champion North Dakota State at 6 p.m. on

Oct. 20 in Sioux Falls at the newly renovated Howard Wood Field. It will be the first game, and exactly five years to the date, since the last time the Coyotes played at Howard Wood Field. USD downed Augustana College on Oct.

Trips to Indiana State (Oct. 27, 1:05 p.m. CST) and Youngstown State (Nov. 3, 12 p.m. CST) follow the NDSU game. The Coyotes close the home slate versus Northern Iowa for Senior Day on Nov. 10 at 12 p.m. in the DakotaDome.


The highly anticipated close to the 2012 regular season comes on Nov. 17 in Brookings as the Coyotes and the South Dakota State Jackrabbits renew their rivalry at 2 p.m. It will be the first meeting on the gridiron between the two teams since 2003 and the first meeting in Brookings since 2002.

Season tickets for the five home games, which includes the North Dakota State game in Sioux Falls, are on sale now in the Coyote Ticket Office or by calling (605) 677-5959. Coyote fans are encouraged to get their season tickets now to help ensure a good seat in the DakotaDome and at Howard Wood Field to "Spread the Red" in both venues.

Season ticket prices are \$104. USD Faculty/Staff tickets are \$89, while the Family Four Pack is \$260.

The Coyote Ticket Office is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday in the DakotaDome. Single game tickets (including the NDSU game) go on sale Aug. 1.

The Tanagers, now 7-3 overall and 4-0 against teams within Region 1B, face a busy weekend, starting with a rematch against rival Beresford/Centerville at Prentis Park tonight (Friday). The varsity game starts at 5 with the JV contest to follow.

On Sunday VHS goes first to Tabor to take on Bon Homme/Scotland again with the first pitch set for 2 p.m. In the evening the varsity will go farther west to Wagner to make up a previous rainout at 7 p.m. Next Thursday VHS goes to Dakota Valley with the varsity team starting play at 5

The Tanagers gained an early 2-0 lead for Morecraft in the first inning against Bon

Homme/Scotland. Leadoff man D'Andre Fore singled, moved to second on a passed ball, advanced to third on Caleb Miller's sacrifice bunt and scored on Chayse Meierkort's RBI hit.

A typical VHS small-ball rally continued as Meierkort stole second, advanced to third on Tanner Anderson's infield grounder and scored on a single by Stormy Mirtz.

The only two hits Morecraft allowed had come back to back in the top of the first inning with one out. But center-fielder Fore threw out the lead runner at the plate with Meierkort applying the tag. A fly ball to center ended the threat.

Bon Homme/Scotland used a hit batter and a wild pitch to pose a mild threat in the fourth, but Meierkort threw out a runner trying to steal

The visitors scored their only run in the fifth off Bertram, but they probably shouldn't have. Bertram struck out the inning's leadoff man, Jeff Honner, but the third strike was dropped, and Honner reached first base. He

promptly scored from there on a double down the leftfield line by Chase Kortan. Kortan was thrown out by Meierkort trying to stretch his hit into a triple.

Bertram in his three innings of work accounted for seven of the nine outs with strikeouts and did not allow another hit.

The Tanagers answered the Bon Homme/Scotland run with one of their own in the bottom of the fifth. Colin Olson, pinch-running for Miller, who reached on a walk, stole second, went to third on Anderson's single and scored on a passed ball.

The fast-moving game, which was completed in about 90 minutes, ended with a triumphant flourish when Bertram struck out the side in the top of the seventh.

Meierkort and Anderson had two hits each among Vermillion's seven.

BH/S starter Blase Vanecek, who allowed all seven hits during his five innings of pitching, took the loss.

The Tanager JVs also won their game against Bon Homme/Scotland.
