Vermillion Plain Talk 03 Pearson wins POL, VFD utilizes new technology on to nationals By Travis Gulbrandson

Samuel Pearson, a senior at Vermillion High School, won the state Poetry Out Loud (POL) competition, Monday in Sioux Falls. Pearson will travel to Washington, D.C., to represent South Dakota at the Poetry Out Loud National Finals April 28-30.

Pearson also won a \$200 cash award, and his school will receive \$500 to be used for poetry books, in addition to his trip to the national finals.

Nine students from high schools across South Dakota competed for the title. Second place in the competition went to Tristan Chasing Hawk, a junior at Harrisburg High School. Chasing Hawk was awarded \$100 cash, and his school will receive \$300 for the purchase of poetry books. Akicita Cistila His Horse is Thunder, who is a senior at Little Wound High School in Kyle, earned the thirdplace spot.

Just three points separated the first-, second- and thirdplace scores. Joshua Hinkemeyer, Sisseton High School, was ranked fourth. The following students received medals for qualifying as state finalists, but the remaining scores were not ranked: Annie Deutscher, Lincoln High School, Sioux Falls; Keana Jackson, Rosholt High School; Savoy Schuler, Stevens High School, Rapid City; Kayla Dittenhauser, Washington High School, Sioux Falls; and

Samantha Elbert, Watertown High School.

Three teachers were also awarded for their efforts in and out of the classroom as Poetry Out Loud coaches. Kim Davidson, Rosholt High School, took the top spot and earned a \$500 cash prize. Sharon Prendergast, Sisseton High School, and Gretchen Brimm, Newell High School each received honorable mentions in the category and \$100 cash.

Poetry Out Loud is a recitation program and competition that urges the teaching of poetry as an oral art form in high schools. Schools that participate in Poetry Out Loud enter students into a preliminary round, from which the state finalists are chosen.

Poetry Out Loud was created in partnership with the National Endowment for the Arts and the Poetry Foundation, with the collaboration of State Arts Agencies. Through Poetry Out Loud, students master publicspeaking skills, build selfconfidence, and learn about their literary heritage.

In South Dakota, POL is a program administered by the South Dakota Arts Council, an office of the state Department of Tourism, in partnership with South Dakotans for the Arts and South Dakota Public Broadcasting.

Until last month, there was no way for the Vermillion Fire Department to know how many of its members were going to respond to a call.

Now, thanks to a Web-based program from

IamResponding.com, they not only know how many will be responding to emergencies, but which members will be responding.

The system works by sending data to a large TV screen that is prominently displayed at the station.

As volunteers verify they will be coming, their name appears on the screen.

"When we receive a call, dispatch sends out a message with the address (of the emergency site) in text form," explained Fire Chief Richard (Shannon) Draper. "Every member has a phone number pre-programmed into their phone. They just dial it and put the phone down, and it will automatically populate the TV screen so that our members know who's responding."

This allows the volunteers to operate on a timelier basis, Draper said.

The biggest hurdle for is us, we're all volunteer, and there are times where I may have a hard time getting some volunteers (to respond)," he said. "Time is of the essence, and so prior to have this system, a big hurdle was not knowing if anyone was coming.

"We might have somebody sitting out on the apron waiting five, 10 minutes, seeing if anyone else will come," he said.

Alternately, volunteers who arrived just a few minutes after everyone else might have found themselves left behind.

"We might have three people jump on a truck and leave, and then all of a sudden somebody else pulls in," Draper said. "Now we can see immediately who is coming, because I'm requiring all our firefighters to use this system."

Along with improving response time, the program also helps Draper decide if he needs to call neighboring departments for assistance.

IamResponding was purchased with funds raised by an association to which the volunteers belong that has in the past bought fire trucks and other equipment for the department, Draper said.

In addition to the program itself, the TVs that display the program data were purchased for both fire stations, as well as the dispatch center.

"They've wanted this for some time," he said. "There seemed to be some questions on the implementation of it, and so I've been working with the company to get through that and get all our questions answered."

The program was installed last month and already has been utilized by the department.

"It's really interesting to watch this during a real emergency because (the screen) fills up real quick," Draper said.

The acquisition of the program makes Vermillion the second community in the area to use it.

"The only other one in this region is North Sioux City," Draper said. "There are other departments that are going toward this, (but) it's totally new to the area." For more information, visit
