Gilsar places second Gas less expensive than last year in high jump

Megan Glisar placed second in section A of the women's high jump as the University of South Dakota track and field team finished competition at the Texas Relays on Saturday.

Glisar, Auburn's Maya Pressley and Texas' Shanay Briscoe all tied for the top-mark of 6 feet (6-0), but Pressley won the event by reaching that mark with fewer misses. Pressley had one miss leading up to the final mark, while Glisar had three misses and Briscoe had four. The mark tied the school outdoor record Glisar set at the Arizona State Invitational on March 23.

Arkansas Spring Invitational University of South Dakota student assistant coach Kenna Wolter placed first in the women's triple jump while iunior distance runner Alex Hohenthaner placed third in the 3,000-meter steeplechase to lead USD track's finishes at the Razorback Spring Invitational.

Wolter won with a 41-41/2 mark, which was 2 feet and 103/4 inches better than second place Shantel Thompson, who competed unattached.

Rachel Weinandt had the second-best finish for the women with a fourth in the 800 (2:17.12), while Lindsey Montileaux was fifth in the same event (2:17.20). Ashley Sveum was sixth in the 400 (56.96) and Taryn Derickson was sixth in the high jump (5-5) to round out the women's top finishers.

Hohenthaner finished third in the steeplechase to lead USD's men finishers. His time of 9:35.87 was a personal best by 17 seconds. Jeff O'Connell added a top-five with a fifth in the long jump (23-9), Michael Burrus placed sixth in the 100 (10.72), and Stephen Nielson was 6th in the 800 (1:58.44).

The USD track teams will next compete at the Dakota Duels in Yankton on April 6.

The national average price of gasoline decreased during March for the first time in 10 years, and gas prices now average nearly 30 cents per gallon less than a year ago. The national average should remain less expensive than last year's prices this spring.

"It is very unusual for gas prices to decline in early spring like we have seen this year," said AAA South Dakota spokeswoman Marilyn Buskohl. "An increase in refinery production and lower oil prices in early March have combined to provide rare falling prices for motorists in comparison to recent years."

This week marks the oneyear anniversary of the 2012 peak in gas prices, when the national average reached \$3.94 per gallon on April 5 and 6. Gas prices peaked in 2011 at \$3.98 per gallon on May 5.

Gas prices declined in March as many refineries resumed normal operations following the completion of seasonal maintenance. The price of West Texas Intermediate (WTI) crude oil also remained relatively low

for much of the month.

Gas prices spiked in late January through February primarily because of supply concerns with refineries in February, which processed the lowest amount of crude oil in nearly two years due to extensive maintenance and facility upgrades.

AAA predicts gasoline prices nationwide in April should remain less expensive than in recent years because oil is cheaper and refinery production is rising. The price of WTI crude oil is about \$6 per barrel less than a year ago, while refinery utilization has increased by about five percent since early March, according to the federal Energy Information Administration.

"AAA has no record of national gas prices ever peaking in February, and it is too early to say whether prices may have hit a high for the first half of the year," said Buskohl. "While it is possible that gas prices may surge briefly again this spring, the national average should remain less than last year's high

of \$3.94 per gallon due to increased domestic production and continued low demand."

Much of the country must transition to more expensive summer-blend gasoline and there is still refinery maintenance left to complete, which could result in a brief surge in gas prices.

Despite experiencing the two largest month-over-month increases at the pump, motorists in Wyoming and Montana still pay the least in the nation for a gallon of gasoline at \$3.33 and \$3.36 respectively. Drivers in three states pay an average of more than \$4.00 per gallon today: Hawaii \$4.38, Calif. \$4.05 and Alaska \$4.01.

While retail gas prices declined steadily in March, oil prices crept higher on signs of continued economic recovery. West Texas Intermediate (WTI) began the month with what was at the time its lowest settlement of the year (\$90.68 per barrel) before rising to end March at its highest price since February 14 (\$97.23). Prices retreated

slightly yesterday as WTI settled 16 cents lower at \$97.07 per barrel at the close of formal trading on the NYMEX.
