'Dons take two from USD

One of the constants in what is shaping up to be a rather memorable season for the University of South Dakota softball team have been close games.

Fifteen times has the result been by one run.

On a chilly Saturday afternoon in Vermillion, the Coyotes dropped a pair of close games to Fort Wayne in Summit League action — by scores of 2-1 and 7-4 in nine innings.

“We lose by one and then go extras, so I think we’re close,” said USD head coach Amy Klyse, whose team falls to 25-14 overall and 8-3 in conference. Eight of those losses have come by one run.

“We just weren’t so much today.”

In a weekend series that was trimmed from three games over two days to just a Saturday doubleheader, the visiting Mastodons (20-8, 4-0) rode the left arm of pitcher Miranda Kramer.

The sophomore from Burlington, Iowa, struck out 15 Coyotes in the opener and added four more in relief in game two — winning both ends.

USD didn’t help itself in crunch time, combining to strand 18 runners on base and issuing 10 walks in the second game.

In short, there are some things to work on, sophomore Matley Jones said.

“Working more together and communicating more on defense are right up there,” said Jones, who was 5-for-8 with three RBI on the day. “We need to execute at the end of games.”

The Coyotes broke through with one run in the bottom of the fifth of a scoreless game one, when Morgan Hancock doubled and Jones followed with an RBI single.

Fort Wayne responded in the sixth with two runs to lead 2-1. USD had a chance to tie the

game in the next frame, but Allie Daly was thrown out at home on a grounder.

There weren’t many missed chances on the day against Kramer. She was especially tough against USD’s top four hitters in the lineup — they combined to go 0-for-12 with 11 strikeouts.

Erica Denney, who struck out seven and walked just one, took the loss for the Coyotes.

“They had a lot of infield hits; too many,” Klyse said. “If

we see them again, or another team like them, that’s something we’ll have to work on.”

The Mastodons struck early in game two, getting three runs in the top of the first inning. The lead reached 4-0 in the third.

Though frustrated most of the day offensively, the Coyotes started their rally in the fourth, getting a Jones RBI single. Then in the fifth, consecutive RBI singles by Yvon Minogue,

Yankton native Christine Broders and Jones tied the game 4-4.

Fort Wayne broke the tie with three runs — on just one hit — in the top of the ninth off Denney to lead 7-4. There were two bases loaded walks and a fielders choice throw that scored a run.

The Coyotes were then able to mount a rally in the bottom of the seventh against Kramer.

“We came back hitting in game two; made it close, but they executed all day,” Klyse said.

Was it any consolation to hang tough with one of the league’s best?

“They’re a great team, so it’s nice to give ourselves a chance,” Jones said. “We just didn’t pull through. But there are still positives from that.”

In what figures to again be a busy week on Nygaard Field (this time because of games, not necessarily weather), the Coyotes will play three more games through the end of the week.

Omaha comes to town Tuesday for a doubleheader, followed by a single game Wednesday.

With still 12 Summit League games to play, the Coyotes are well aware of what lies ahead, Klyse said.

“Our goal is to get to the conference tournament,” she said. “None of these kids have been there, so we need close games like these to get us ready.”

Tanagers defeat Bon Homme 2-0 Monday

With his teammates unable to generate much offense against Bon Homme pitcher Ross Kortan, it was up to Tanager hurler Colin Olson to contain the opposition.

That’s exactly what he did Monday night as Vermillion squeaked in a home high school baseball game between snowstorms and defeated Bon Homme at Prentiss Park, 2-0.

Olson threw a complete-game, two-hit shutout. Only four Bon Homme hitters reached base. A leadoff batter in the top of the fourth drew a walk but was thrown out at second base by catcher Jayce Huska. Later in that inning Blase

Vanecek broke up Olson’s no-hitter with a two-out single. Brendan Bares singled with one out in the sixth but was also stranded. A Bon Homme batter reached on an error in the seventh, but the next batter grounded out to end the game.

Meanwhile, the Tanagers took advantage of Bon Homme’s faulty defense, scoring the game’s first run in the third without the aid of a hit. Joe Mazour reached base on pitcher Kortan’s throwing error, was sacrificed to second by Seth Heine, moved on to third on another infield error and scored on Tanner Settles’ sacrifice fly.

Vermillion’s other run in the fifth also was unearned. Peter Haught opened the inning by reaching second base on an error. Mazour’s ground-out moved him

to third, and Heine’s single brought Haught across the plate.

The Tanagers’ only other hit was a first-inning single by Huska.

Olson struck out three and walked one in his two-hit masterpiece. Kortan fanned four and walked none but was victimized by his and his teammates’ errors.

The victory improved the Tanagers’ record to 5-1. A rematch with Bon Homme is scheduled to be played at Tabor tonight (Friday) at 5:30 with a JV game to follow.

Vermillion will also be home Monday against Mount Vernon-Plankinton-Woonsocket in a single contest at 7 p.m. Next Wednesday the Tanagers go to Emery to play Hanson County.

Last Saturday’s scheduled home game against Wagner has been rescheduled for May 9. With the schedule changing constantly due to the weather, fans can keep up to date on when the Tanagers play by checking the school website at www.vermillion.k12.sd.us and clicking on “high school,” then “athletics,” then “baseball.”

The other spring sports teams were all shut out of competition last week by the weather. The track teams are supposed to compete at Dakota Valley next Tuesday and at Yankton Thursday, and the boys’ tennis team will be at home Tuesday against Yankton. Next action for the girls’ golf team is April 29 in their own invitational tournament.
