

Coyotes, Jags split

VERMILLION — On a day when the University of South Dakota softball team was again able to showcase its balanced offensive attack, it was still forced to settle for a doubleheader split.

As such, the Coyotes maintained their hold on third place in the Summit League race after beating IUPUI 13-5 in the five-inning opener and falling short 8-7 in the second game Friday afternoon, April 18, in Vermillion.

"It doesn't matter what the count is, we can get a hit any time from any player," said sophomore Katie Cochran, who homered from the ninth spot in the batting order.

"It's awesome having that one through nine power."

Steady winds played a key role in the offensive outburst, as the teams combined for eight home runs (and nine errors), many of which would have likely been harmless fly balls any other day.

Those conditions, though, played right into the hand of the aggressive Coyotes (24-15, 6-4), according to head coach Amy Klyse.

"Our hitters came out

attacking, and it was great to see us score so many runs," Klyse said. "Part of that was the elements, but they came out swinging too, which we knew they would."

Every Coyote starter had at least one hit in the doubleheader, led by Katie Dinning's four. A total of four players hit a home run, while Cochran and Lindsey Boyd both drove in four runs.

Another stat Klyse pointed out later: All nine regulars boast at least 10 RBI — and four have at least 20.

"It's great to see we've had that production," Klyse said. "That just proves that literally anyone can step up and produce in pressure situations."

Those kinds of situations were few and far between in the first game.

Cochran hit a 3-run homer in the second inning and Lindsey Boyd drilled a grand slam in the third, to give USD an 8-2 lead.

After three straight runs by the Jaguars, the Coyotes responded with a 3-run sacrifice bunt by Boyd that resulted in two errors and all three runners crossing the plate. Following a pair of walks, Morgan Hancock's 2-run double ended the game by the 8-



run rule, 13-5.

The second game was when USD was put to the test, and ultimately came up just short.

IUPUI jumped ahead 5-2 in the third inning thanks to two home runs.

Back-to-back USD home runs from Yvon Minogue and Allie Daly brought the Coyotes within 5-4 in the third, and a Dinning RBI single in the fourth tied the game.

IUPUI pulled ahead 6-5

in the fifth and got a 2-run single by Roni Patterson in the sixth. In the bottom of the sixth, Cochran had an RBI double and Minogue later added an RBI single, bringing USD within 8-7. The Coyotes then went down 1-2-3 in the seventh.

"We're usually good about capitalizing on mistakes, but they did that against us today," Cochran said. Three USD pitchers combined to issue six walks in game two.

"We were just a little short."

Coyote freshman ace pitcher Rachel Cue appeared in both games, picking up the 5-inning win in game one despite allowing five earned runs. She then went 2 1/3

innings in game two, allowing two more runs. "Her game is to get ahead and attack, and not let one hit turn into two, and I think they got to her a little today," Klyse said.

"But hopefully she can come back with a strong performance (today)."

Cue will be in the pitching circle for the Coyotes in today's (Saturday) noon series finale at Nygaard Field in Vermillion.
