## OBITUARIES

### Philip Michael

Philip J. Michael, Peace Corps volunteer, environmentalist, nonprofit financial manager, and a long-time resident on Connecticut Avenue in Washington, D.C., died on March 11, in Colorado Springs, Colorado, where he was attended by his family. The causes of death were complications from back surgery and lung cancer. He was 75.

Philip was born in 1939 in Indianapolis, Indiana. In 1952 the family moved to Vermillion, South Dakota. He graduated from Vermillion High School in 1957. He studied at Stanford University and the University of South Dakota. He decided to interrupt his college career when he heard President John F. Kennedy's speech establishing the Peace Corps. He immediately volunteered and was in the first group of volunteers that went to Somalia in 1962 - 1964. He taught English, math, and science in the village of Odweina.

He returned to Stanford, and studied political science. He graduated in January 1966. He then worked for a Peace Corps Somalia training project before volunteering again himself and going to Nigeria in the fall of 1966. He served as an Education Officer assigned to the Women's Training College in Kabba where he worked with the Teacher's In-Service Education Program teaching English, math, history, geography and health/physical education to underqualified primary school teachers.

Back in the States in 1968, he moved to Washington to pursue his interests in government and public service. Becoming active with

the group organizing the first Earth Day, he helped to coordinate local events and the massive concert on the National Mall on April 22, 1970. He then stayed on with the organization for 12 years - the second-longest tenure of any Environmental Action staffer. His role with the non-hierarchical organization was as unusual as it was pivotal: handling the financial books and designing Environmental Action Magazine.

In 1983, Michael and friends from Environmental Action set up a consulting company, Management on Call, which helped nonprofits with everything from setting up accounting systems and retirement plans to organizing a move. He later worked for several international nonprofit organizations, including Ashoka. His final position, from 2000 until retiring in 2012, was as Finance Director for the American Council for an Energy-Efficient Economy.

Philip loved watching car racing and figure skating, cooking, and catching up with friends at reunions. His taciturn manner belied a great wit, and after a beer or two he delighted in telling the story of the theft of the rented grand piano on the Mall on Earth Day.

He is survived by his brother Colin; sister-in-law Elisa; sister Cora Louise; sister Mary Ann; brother-in-law, Frederic; three nephews, Colin, Grafton, and David; one niece, Megan; and six grand-nephews and nieces.

### Dr. Raja Parasuraman

Dr. Raja Parasuraman of Falls Church, Virginia, died on Sunday, March 22. He is survived by his wife and colleague, Carryl Baldwin, daughters Rachna and Shanta Parasuraman, and their mother Rashmi Sinha.

Dr. Parasuraman was a University Professor at George Mason University in Fairfax, Virginia, where he served as the Director of the Human Factors and Applied Cognition Program in the Department of Psychology and the Director of the Center of Excellence in Neuroergonomics, Technology, and Cognition (CENTEC). Previously he held appointments as Professor and Associate Professor of Psychology at The Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C. from 1982 to 2004. He received a B.Sc. (1st Class Honors) in Electrical Engineering from Imperial College, University of London, U.K. (1972) and a Ph.D. in Psychology from Aston University, Birmingham, U.K. (1976).

He was an excellent father, friend, mentor, chef,

musician, and lover of food, wine and fun. In remembrance of his spirit of loving kindness and wisdom the

family will receive friends from 5:00 - 9:00 pm on Wednesday, April 1, 2015, at Murphy Funeral Home, 1102 West Broad Street, Falls Church, VA 22046.
