The University of South Dakota's online master's in education programs received an "A" for affordability from GetEducated.com, a consumer watchdog group that reviews and ranks online universities for cost, quality and credibility.

USD's School of Education, in concert with the Graduate School and Division of Continuing and Distance Education, earned award badges in ranking as a top Best Buy among online education degrees for teachers and educators for Education Administration for Master of Arts in Educational Administration (13th overall); Educational Technology for Master of Science in Technology for Education & Training/ K-12 Education (23rd overall); and Best Affordable Online Masters of Education for Master of Arts in Educational Administration (44th overall) and Master of Science in Technology for Education & Training/ K-12 Education (65th overall) degrees.

The average overall cost for all master's degrees in the online learning survey was \$16,731, putting some of USD's education programs in the top 20 percent of the most affordable online education masters.

USD Social Work Department celebrates graduation of first Master of Social Work cohort

The Department of Social Work at the University of South Dakota celebrated the graduation of its first class of Master of Social Work (M.S.W.) students July 22 when a pinning ceremony recognizing the 23 graduates was held at Hope Lutheran Church in Sioux Falls.

Speakers at the ceremony included Michael Lawler, Ph.D., dean of USD's School of Health Sciences, Charles Schwartz, Ph.D., professor emeritus and the retired chair of USD's Department of Social Work, and Joan McMillian, retired executive director of the South Dakota chapter of the National Association of Social Workers.

"This significant milestone will move forward social services in South Dakota and fill a void in the workforce," said Elizabeth Talbot, Ph.D., associate professor of social work and director of the M.S.W. program. "Many agencies have been waiting for our graduates and are anxious to hire them for positions that have remained vacant for a long time."

According to Talbot, the graduates' employment outlook is strong due to the demand for highly trained experts in social work fields. Graduates of USD's M.S.W. program, the only one in South Dakota, will be eligible to become licensed for clinical services, move into leadership positions in various agencies or pursue private practice.

Agencies who employ M.S.W. graduates can receive third-party reimbursements, Medicaid and Medicare reimbursements and other insurance reimbursements, which bring federal dollars to the state.

"Many of our recent graduates have already been hired by agencies," said Talbot.
