Dakota junior forward Jenny Teslow scored two second-half goals, including a game-tying score with eight seconds left, to lead the Coyotes in a 4-4 draw with North Dakota Sunday at USD Soccer Complex.

Teslow's late score completed a flurry of goals in the final five minutes of regulation. South Dakota's Lauren Bennett knotted the game at 3-3 by drilling a header off a well-placed corner kick from teammate Taylor Nivala. It was Bennett's first collegiate goal.

North Dakota (1-2-1) regained the lead less than three minutes later when Noah Mithrush knocked in a rebound after Megan Anderson's long shot from the left side ricocheted off the right post. North Dakota led 4-3 with 2:29 remaining.

Coyote goalkeeper Abby Lindsey sent a ball across midfield in the closing seconds. The ball took a bounce and found Teslow who pushed to the right side of the box before deflecting a shot off the out-stretched

arms of North Dakota keeper Kristi Hestdalen and into the left side of the net to send the game into overtime.

Teslow had the best chance to win it in the extra frames. A defensive miscue by North Dakota in the opening minute of overtime gave Teslow a one-on-one with Hestdalen, but Teslow's shot sailed high of the bar. North Dakota's Sheri Stapf placed the only shot on goal during overtime.

North Dakota scored twice in the first 12 minutes and led 3-1 at halftime. South Dakota out-shot North Dakota 14-5 the rest of the way.

The Coyotes (0-2-1) return to the pitch Tuesday against Creighton. Game time from USD Soccer Complex is 4 p.m.

After loss to Trojans, VHS football faces SSC in Dome Friday

Chances are the Tanager football team has been working on its pass defense this week, not because last Friday's opponent, West Central, did any damage at all through the air, but rather because tonight's foe, South Sioux City, may keep the air inside the DakotaDome filled with

flying footballs. Vermillion will be trying to rebound from a 35-0 loss at West Central against a South Sioux club that scored all three of its touchdowns via long pass plays in its 21-7

win over Platteview, NE. Kickoff is at 7 p.m. tonight in the Tanagers' home opener. A 35-0 score sounds like a thorough trouncing, and in the end it probably has to be considered that, but the Trojans led by only 14-0 through three quarters, and both of their first-quarter touchdowns were set up by painfully crucial Vermillion turnovers. West Central scored twice within the first three minutes of the fourth quarter and finally with only 1:18 remaining to push their total of 14 points up to 35.

Culver said. "We found out a lot about ourselves in the game. Obviously we will have to make some big improvements in different areas in order to be ready for our upcoming games."

Four turnovers - two interceptions and two fumbles – were costly, especially the first two. An interception in the first period set up West Central for its first score, a sixyard run by Cody Miller. At the end of the period the Trojans went ahead by two scores on a four-yard plunge by Noah Matson.

If the Tanagers were going to make a game of it, they needed to convert their final possession of the first half. Vermillion reached the 3-yard line, but on a third down play from there, the ball was lost on a fumble. Instead of a potential 14-7 game, West Central was able to survive into halftime with its 14-0 lead intact.

West Central's defense held Vermillion to 95 total yards, only 10 of them on the ground in 23 running plays. Quarterback Kyle Weiss passed for the other 85 yards, 53 of them being gained by Tanner Anderson in four receptions and 32 of them by Regan Bye in his two catches. The Trojans' final three scores came where else? – on the ground on runs of two, nine and four yards, adding yards to West Central's massive total of 315 yards rushing in 59 carries. Quarterback Matson

also passed for 32 yards.

When they weren't scoring, the Trojans were still controlling the game. Several long drives consumed clock time, and West Central was forced to punt only once.

Tyler Madsen and Alex Osborne with 11 tackles each, Bye with 10, Thomas Walker and Avery Garcia with nine each and Ty Iverson with six led the Vermillion defense.

"I thought our kids played hard throughout the entire contest," Culver added, "and we came through with no major injuries, which is crucial for our team until we gain some depth on both sides of the ball."


