# Teeners take region's top spot

For the third time this summer, a Vermillion squad is hoisting a region championship trophy and heading to the state tournament.

The 15/16 Teeners put on a dominant performance in their undefeated run through the region tournament, outscoring opponents 28-7 over four games. Vermillion hosted the double-elimination tournament's first two rounds, which saw the home squad dismantle Elk Point 11-1 and edge Dakota Valley 5-3.

The tournament then moved to Lennox, where the Teeners outlasted Harrisburg 4-2 in the semifinal before Harrisburg won its way back into the championship game.

Harrisburg would have needed to beat Vermillion twice to take the crown, but Vermillion put them to bed in game one with a convincing 8-1 win.

With the victory, the 15/16's join the Vermillion Post 1 Legion and the 13/14 Teeners as region champions this year.

Vermillion, 11 - Elk Point, 1  
Regan Bye took the mound in game one last Tuesday to face Elk Point, an opponent the Teeners had beaten by double digits twice this season. A powerful offensive attack decided the game early in Vermillion's favor. The home squad scored in four of the game's five innings before the game was ended by the mercy rule.

In the first inning, Joe Miller doubled to spark the offense in the first inning. Travis Weber's sacrifice fly later that inning scored Miller and opened the floodgates for the Teeners.

As the offense rolled, Bye did his part on the mound, holding Elk Point to one run on two hits in

four innings. Brandon Mockler relieved Bye for the fifth inning, pitching a scoreless frame to end the game.

**Vermillion, 5 - Dakota Valley, 3**

With each team winning its first round game, Vermillion and Dakota Valley clashed in a pivotal second round contest. Dakota Valley had bested Vermillion 18-17 in a wild

regular season game early in the year, but the Teeners were out for revenge.

Wyatt Markee took the ball for Vermillion, turning in a four-inning, three-run effort to capture the win. The Vermillion offense came alive early to get a lead, but the defense secured the victory in the tight game.

In the first inning, Vermillion got on the board first when

Miller sent a towering double off the left field fence and Weber roped a single up the middle to bring him home. The Teeners added to their total in the second with a four-run outburst. After walks to Jake Odens, Matt Ouellette, and Brandon Mockler loaded the bases, Miller delivered a two-RBI single to left field.

## USD tennis honored for academic achievement Ticket pack sells out in less than 24 hours

University of South Dakota's tennis team is the lone Summit League program and one of 62 teams nationally to be named an Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) All-Academic Team for achieving a cumulative team grade point average of 3.2 or above.

USD turned in a team GPA of 3.42. It is the eighth time in the last nine years

that the Coyotes' have been named an All-Academic Team.

"I am proud of our ladies for another great year of work on the courts and in the classroom," said USD head tennis coach Malcolm Gilreath. "It is terrific to see them rewarded and recognized in this way."

In addition to the team distinction, five Coyotes

earned ITA Scholar-Athlete status for earning a GPA of at least 3.5 for the current academic year.

Those members include senior Veronika Makashov, juniors Maddy Warder and Michelle Elkin, and sophomores Nina Barudzic and Yamini Reddy.

USD has had 34 individual award winners in the last nine seasons.

The University of South Dakota's football ticket pack that included admission to the South Dakota State game on Nov. 16 at the DakotaDome has sold out within the first 48 hours of going on sale.
