

Petty named City council discusses bid USD dean of for new landfill building enrollment

The University of South Dakota has announced Mark Petty as dean of enrollment. Petty, a native of Sioux City, IA, will manage enrollment services overseeing the undergraduate admissions operation.

Petty comes to USD after serving as associate vice president and dean for admission at Iowa Wesleyan College. While at the Mount Pleasant, Iowa institution, Petty was an active member of the Iowa Association for College Admission Counseling (Iowa ACAC) where he most recently served as president. He was also a member of the Iowa ACT Council, planning chair for Iowa Private College Week, president of the Mount Pleasant Area Chamber Alliance and the 2010 Iowa ACAC Admissions Professional of the Year.

"I'm very excited to be at the University of South Dakota," said Petty, who received a bachelor's degree from the University of Iowa. "USD has very solid academic programs and a rich history, and I'm happy to be part of it."

Petty's career began in 1999 as an admissions counselor at Buena Vista

University in Storm Lake, IA. Eventually, he became assistant director and, later, associate director of admissions at BVU before going to Iowa Wesleyan in 2006. His achievements in student recruitment at Iowa Wesleyan include enrolling the largest freshman class in three decades for two consecutive years, increasing the average student profile of the entering class, and implementing a new scholarship program as the institution changed athletic affiliations.

"It's about working together and building relationships," added Petty, who has three sons, Luke, 10, Jack, 8, and Bennet, 3, with his wife, Jenny. "At the end of the day, we all want to build a positive relationship with a student and their family as they are moving through the college selection process. If we can do that, have them visit campus to discover all of the great things here, then there's a great likelihood that they'll join USD."

The Vermillion City Council has discussed a bid for the construction of a new baler building for the landfill, as well as submitted a grant to fund part of the project.

The action was taken at the council's regular meeting, which was held Monday night.

According to city engineer José Domínguez, the city and its insurance carrier have agreed on a replacement cost of \$663,788 for a new baler building to replace the one that was destroyed in a fire at the Vermillion Sanitary Landfill on Oct. 22, 2012.

The low bid was from Peska Construction of Sioux Falls, for the amount of \$1,060,000.

The engineer's estimate was for \$850,000.

Domínguez said the reason the price has increased is because the new building will be larger than the previous one, measuring 80 feet by

160 feet, compared to 80 feet by 130 feet.

"The increase in size is based on several factors, but can be summed up (by) safety issues, size for storing equipment and so forth, and also just the way that the building is used during landfill operations. It was pretty near capacity," Domínguez said.

Landfill director Bob Iverson added that there were no water sprinklers in the old building. While he said there will not be any in the new building, either, there will be an alarm system that will alert firefighters should a fire break out.

Approval of the bid was tabled until Aug. 14, when the city council will meet to review the 2014 budget.

Domínguez said staff will either have a recommendation to approve a lower bid amount or rebid the project by that time.

The project was not budgeted for in 2013, as the fire had not yet occurred. In addition to the

insurance money, the city and Yankton County will join to fund \$133,503 of the project.

Up to \$200,000 in additional funds may also be covered by a grant from the South Dakota Department of Energy and Natural Resources.

The council voted to submit the grant application at Monday's meeting.

Last October's fire at the landfill's baler building led to the loss of items including the baler, conveyor and a truck.

In meetings last November, the city council replaced a wheel loader that was lost, as well as fire department gear that was damaged during the blaze.

This past June the city council approved the purchase of a new baler and conveyor for the landfill.

The cause of the fire was undetermined following inspections from fire investigators.

Renowned clinician, researcher and educator Marilyn Lash, M.S.W., will present a training called "Educating Students with Brain Injuries: Strategies, Tools and Resources for Teachers, Therapists and Families" in Sioux Falls, Aug. 13-14.

Lash, the president of Lash and Associates Publishing/Training, Inc. in North Carolina, is author of many manuals, workbooks and tip cards on the effects of acquired and traumatic brain injuries in children and youth.

As a consultant to school systems, she focuses on the cognitive, behavioral and social impact of trauma to a student's developing brain and provides tools and strategies for practical application by educators in the classroom.

In addition to the educational needs of

students with brain injury, she addresses the emotional needs of parents for support and communication following the onset of their child's disability.

She added that Rederick does not have a job, and that she thinks he is a flight risk.

"I don't think he is a good candidate to be out on the streets at this time," she said.

Eng made no changes to the bond, and said Rederick must continue to take part in the 24/7 program and have no contact with his alleged victim.

Rederick was investigated by the Clay County Sheriff's Office with assistance from the South Dakota Division of Criminal Investigation following a report on July 19 of alleged sexual contact between him and a 13-year-old girl.

This is not the first time Rederick has been cited in the courts. Eng said he was

previously convicted of intent to distribute meth in Minnehaha County in 2001.

Rederick's name also has been seen in the police logs of the Vermillion Plain Talk and the Yankton Press & Dakotan, most recently in the May 9, 2013 edition of the P&D, where he is listed as being arrested on a 24/7 violation.

A jury trial has been set for 9 a.m., Sept. 23 at the Clay County Courthouse. Rederick has the option of taking a plea until Sept. 3.
