NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND

With the passage of the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Legislation, parents of all school children have a right to know the professional qualifications of classroom teachers who instruct their child. Federal laws allow you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers, and requires us to give you this information in a timely manner if you request it. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers.

Whether the state of South Dakota has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.

Whether the state of South Dakota has decided that the teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.

The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees, and if so, the subject(s) of the degree(s).

Whether any teachers' aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child, and if they do, their qualifications.

Children in the Title I program will be taught by a highly qualified teacher. A Highly Qualified teacher is a teacher who has full state certification from the Department of Education at the state level, and has a minimum of three years experience or has passed the "Praxis" exam for the subject to which they are assigned. If you wish to know the status of your child's teacher, please contact your child's principal. A timely notice will be sent to the appropriate parents that the parent's child has been assigned, or has been taught for 4 or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified.

NCLB SELECTIVE SERVICES

The NCLB law requires school districts to provide student information to Selective Services such as names, addresses, and telephone numbers. If parents or guardians choose to not have the school release this information to the Selective Service they should send this request to Vermillion High School Principal's Office, 1001 East Main, Vermillion, SD 57069.

NCLB Allows Request of Teacher Qualifications

The federal NCLB law requires that Title I schools notify parents of their right to request information about the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teachers. The Elementary and High Schools are provided Title I services so parents may request teacher qualifications for their students at these levels. Parents may request this information by contacting Austin Elementary Principal Kim Johnson at kimmari.e.johnson@k12.sd.us, Jolley Elementary Principal Sue Galvin at sue.galvin@k12.sd.us, and Middle School Principal Pat Anderson at patrick.anderson@k12.sd.us, and High School Principal Curt Cameron at curt.cameron@k12.sd.us. CHILD FIND

Public Law 101 charges all school districts with a basic commitment to educate all children with disabilities in a "least restrictive environment". The Vermillion School District employs a school psychologist, speech therapist, physical therapist, occupational therapist, and special education teachers to help determine and meet the needs of children with disabilities. Students whose special handicaps that cannot be adequately taken care of in the Vermillion School System are enrolled outside the district where proper facilities and instructors are available.

In order to discover the child, Vermillion School District must have the cooperation of parents, instructors, counselors, health organizations and other community organizations. Through the efforts of all, Vermillion School District can then identify and provide the necessary service to give children with disabilities the

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best possible educational opportunity. This may take the form of special placement, but all must keep in mind that the child must be placed in the "least restrictive environment".

To implement this, the Vermillion School District must have input from parents, instructors, and others concerned with the education of children under the age of 21.

If you have or know of a child in need of special services or assistance, please contact Special Services Director, Grace Benson at 677-7025. Observation, testing and other evaluative procedures will then be employed. Every effort will be made to help meet the child's needs.

SECTION 504 OF THE REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973

Section 504 is an Act which prohibits discrimination against individuals with disabilities in any program receiving federal financial assistance. The Act defines a person with a disability as anyone who:

- 1. has a mental or physical impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities (major life activities include activities such as caring for one's self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning, and working);
2. has a record of such impairment; or
3. is regarded as having such an impairment.

In order to fulfill obligations under Section 504, the Vermillion School District has the responsibility to avoid discrimination in policies and practices regarding its personnel and students. Discrimination against any person with a disability should not knowingly be permitted in any of the programs and practices of the school system.

The school district has responsibilities under Section 504, which include the obligation to identify, evaluate, and if the student is determined to be eligible under Section 504, to provide appropriate educational services. If the parent or guardian disagrees with the determination made by the professional staff of

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the school district, he/she has a right to a hearing with an impartial hearing officer.

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) also specifies rights related to educational records. This Act gives the parent or guardian the right to:

- 1. inspect and review his/her child's educational records;
2. make copies of these records;
3. receive a list of all individuals having access to those records;
4. ask for an explanation of any item in the records;
5. ask for an amendment to any record on the grounds that it is inaccurate, misleading, or violates the child's rights; and
6. a hearing on the issue if the school refuses to make the amendment.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) Notice of Rights - Student Records

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents, guardians and students who are 18 years of age or older ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are:

- 1. The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days after the day Vermillion School District 13-1 (school) receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal a written request that identifies the records they wish to inspect. The school official will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
2. The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes
