Unapproved Minutes Council Special Session August 3, 2015 Monday 12:00 noon

The special session of the City Council, City of Vermillion, South Dakota was held on Monday, August 3, 2015 at 12:00 noon at the City Hall large conference room.

Powell Absent: Holly Meins 2. Informational Session - Presentation of legal newspaper bids -

Andy Colvin

Mike Carlson, Finance Officer, reported that in June the City received a letter from Scott Munger, Owner and Publisher of The Equalizer newspaper, about becoming the official legal newspaper for the City. Mike noted that State statute requires all political subdivisions to establish a legal newspaper for notices and other required publications. The City Council directed staff to develop an RFP to be sent to The Plain Talk, which is the current legal newspaper for the City, and The Equalizer. Mike stated that both RFP were included in the packet and that each party was invited to present their proposals in person to the City Council at this meeting. Mike noted that no action is required but this will provide the City Council the opportunity to ask questions. If the Council wants to take an action, they will need to request staff to include the action item on a future agenda.

Scott Munger, owner of The Equalizer, reported that The Equalizer meets the State requirements to be an official newspaper. Scott reviewed why The Equalizer should be considered for the City's official newspaper.

Gary Wood, owner of the Plain Talk, reported that the newspaper has been operating in the city since 1884 and provides local news and information only. Gary reviewed the commitment to the community though contributions to local organizations. Gary reviewed the service that the Plain Talk has been providing to the city as the legal newspaper.

The City Council asked questions of the owners on their newspaper.

3. Historic Preservation Incentives - Jim Wilson

Jim Wilson, Chairman of the Clav County Historic Preservation Commission, reviewed the financial benefits available to building owners in the three historic districts in Vermillion. Jim noted that the Commission is currently working on adding another district. Jim reviewed the 20% federal tax credit available for rehabilitation of historic income producing buildings that are certified historic structures. Jim reported on the State of SD eight year property tax moratorium for

rehabilitation work on buildings listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Jim noted that to qualify for both programs the rehabilitation work must conform to the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for rehabilitation. Jim stated that he wanted to get the work out as he felt there are a number of rehabilitation projects being done that the owners are not taking advantage of these programs. Jim answered questions of the City Council on the programs.
