Unapproved Minutes Council Special Budget Session August 11, 2015 Tuesday 5:15 p.m.

The special budget session of the City Council, City of Vermillion, South Dakota was called to order on Tuesday, August 11, 2015 at 5:15 p.m. at the City Hall large conference room.

1. Roll Call
Present: Collier-Wise, Erickson, Holland, Clarene Meins, Holly Meins, Price, Ward, Willson, Mayor Powell
2. Pledge of Allegiance
3. Adoption of Agenda 249-15
Alderman Price moved approval of the agenda. Alderman Collier-Wise seconded the motion. Motion carried 9 to 0. Mayor Powell declared the motion adopted.
4. Budget Workshop
John Prescott, City Manager, provided an overview of the budget noting that the budget presented should serve as the starting point for the process of developing the 2016 budget. John reported that for the property tax revenues the State caps the increase to 1.5% but the budget as presented includes only 1%. John stated that the sales tax was budgeted to increase 3% for 2016 and that utility rate increases of 2% were included for electric, water and wastewater. John stated that curbside collection fee is proposed to increase from \$3.30 per month to \$3.50 as the rate has remained the same since the program started in 2008. John stated that the wages were increased 2.5% based upon negotiations with the AFSME union. John stated that the expenditures for street chip seal has been moved from the general fund to second penny sales tax and increased to \$93,000 for 2016. John noted that one of the larger projects for 2016 will be the swimming pool as final design costs are not available yet. John stated that estimates were included for design costs for 2015 and project costs for 2016 that will need to be amended once engineer's estimates are available. John noted that the County will be updating the aerial photos of the county and the City cost to access will be \$4,600. John stated that he has included the outside agencies in the general fund and BBB sales tax fund but two other items the City Council might want to consider for 2016 would be a Housing Study and metal banners for the Cherry Street light poles. John reviewed some of the items revised in the 2015 budget based on information available now.

The Council started the review of the 2016 proposed budget, as well as revisions to the 2015 budget, by reviewing the following sections of the budget with the City Manager and department heads: Public Safety and Security; Police Administration and Investigation, Police Patrol; Emergency; Communications - 911 Fund; Human Development and Leisure; Public Library, Library Fund; Utility Fund; Joint Powers Landfill, Joint Powers Recycling, Curbside Recycling, Water, Wastewater, Electric; Equipment Replacement Fund; Policy and Administration; Engineering, Old Library Maintenance, Old Landfill Maintenance, Airport, Storm Water Collection; Capital Projects Fund; Special Assessment, Airport Improvement, West Main, Bliss Pointe, Bike Path, Prentis Park; Maintenance and Transportation; Service Center, Me-

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chanic's Garage, Street Department, Snow Removal, Sweeping and Mowing, Carpentry; Outside Organization Requests: General Fund - Community Services, BBB Fund and Wrap-up of Budget Items. Discussion followed on the outside agency requests noting that the budget hearings will continue on August 13th.

While in high school she was active in show choir, dance, vice president of the Vermillion High School National Honors Society and the Jolly JJ's 4-H club.

That schedule will continue this fall as part of the USD Dance team. She has also volunteered more than 150 hours of her time with the Vermillion Weekend Backpack Program as well as many other programs.

"I haven't tracked community hours, but I got to MC the Clay County Fair princess contest," Hanson said. "I have worked with the backpack club, I got to help with the Miss Amazing Pageant. I think that was my favorite event I got to go to. It was so inspiring getting to talk to the girls and meet them. I have done a lot of parades, but my favorite are where I get to interact with people."

She also noted she enjoyed working with the Operation That's my Dress event in Jacksonville, Florida and Syracuse, New York.

"I got to model Sherri Hill dresses that military daughters, wives and service women got to try on and possibly take home," Hanson said. "I got to help some of the girls pick out a prom or a date dress that they got to take home with them that day. It was a really empowering event knowing that I helped a girl find her perfect dress and forget about having her father or spouse deployed even if it was just for a while. I also loved getting to hear their stories."

She said she has learned great lessons by being involved and that Vermillion has been key to her success.

"I think I am going to remember to stay involved. The skills I have learned definitely prepare you for the pageant but they also prepare you for real life," Hanson said. "I think because there is so much going on in

the area and so many opportunities for us to grow and become strong women, it helps us to win these titles," referencing three reigning title winners at USD.

However, Hanson said her week actually began this Monday when she and her parents Pamela and Marlon Hanson and sister Ellen began their trip. She noted that events began on Tuesday.

"We will have a get to know you event and get settled in," she said. "Wednesday we will have rehearsals and a welcome party. Then Friday is the preliminary competition. We have our personality interviews in the morning. Then Saturday we have more preliminaries and our final competition. They keep us pretty busy."

Contestants will be judged in three categories: swimsuit, evening gown and interview.


"On Saturday they will take it from 51 girls to 15, from there to 10 and then the final five," Hanson said. "Recently I have been doing a lot of mock interviews getting ready, walking on the stage, getting ready for the swimsuit and evening gown competitions. There has been a lot of preparation."
