For Challenge Of Longer Races Improve On Eighth Place Finish

S.D. Girls' Varsity Races Move To 5,000 Meters In 2015

The Yankton Gazelles have trained for 5,000-meter cross country races since the days when they were running against the nation's elite in the Nike Team Nationals (now called "Nike Cross Nationals") a decade ago.

So when the South Dakota High School Activities Association voted to change its girls' races from 4,000 to 5,000 meters, it wasn't a big deal for the Gazelles.

'We've trained for that distance anyway," said Yankton head cross country coach Dave Dannenbring. "I don't think it's been that big a deal to them."

Yankton has competed at the 5,000-meter distance in recent years as well, as Nebraska made the move to 5,000 meters – the same distance the boys run - two years ago. The Gazelles won the South Sioux City meet in 2013, going 1-2-3 individually. Last year, the Gazelles finished third as a team in Norfolk, with Savannah Woods placing second.

"I was pretty excited," Woods said about South Dakota's move to 5K. Woods was the Class AA cross country champ as a freshman, and won the 3,200-meter run at the state track meet this past spring. "It's not much of a transition.

The difference between the two distances is 1,000 meters, or about .62 miles.

What I told the girls was that this was more of a true distance race," said Beresford head coach Matt Coy. "Our girls were pumped about it. They took a positive attitude about it.'

Beresford junior Ashlynn Atwood, 17th in Class A a season ago, said that the off-season workouts for her and her teammates changed slightly, but not significantly.

"We ran a little further each run," she said. "But mostly we did not really change things.

While coaches from both Class AA and Class A had predominantly backed the change in statewide polls, Class B coaches were split.

"A lot of Class B coaches didn't want to see it because of all the two-sport athletes (that run cross country), said Gayville-Volin head coach Larry Buffington, whose team has finished second in Class B each of the past three seasons. "To me, cross country should

be more of a distance race. If Nebraska can do it (go to 5,000 meters for girls), we can too.'

Both Coy and Dannenbring said that they expected the move to help their teams.

"As coaches, we actually think it is going to help us," Dannenbring said. "We think we have the 'X' factor here in the horse trails. It makes our runners stronger over a longer distance.

"We think it is definitely to our advantage."
