Coyote football announces additions to coaching staff

University of South Dakota first-year head football coach Joe Glenn announced Monday the additions of two assistant coaches for the 2012 season. Jason Petrino was hired as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach, while Brett Harvey was hired as the offensive line coach.

Both Petrino and Harvey have ties to Glenn as Petrino coached with Glenn at Wyoming and Harvey was Glenn's first recruit when he took over at the University of Northern Colorado

Petrino, a native of Kalispell, MT, was hired at University of Nebraska-Omaha in February of 2011, prior to the program being cut from the school. He then spent this past fall at Central Oklahoma where he was the defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator. In 2010, he served as co-defensive coordinator at Winona State.

He had two stints with Glenn at the University of Wyoming as Director of Football Operations in 2008 and 2009 and was a graduate assistant in 2003 and 2004 as he helped with the safeties as he helped lead the team to victories over rivals BYU and Colorado State in 2003 and helped the Cowboys defeat UCLA 24-21 in the 2004 Pioneer PureVision Las Vegas bowl.

Prior to his second stint in Laramie, Petrino spent three seasons at the defensive coordinator at the University of Mary, a Division II school located in Bismarck, ND. Along with coordinating the Marauder defense, Petrino also coached the defensive backs and was the recruiting coordinator.

In his three seasons at the University of Mary, Petrino helped lead the Marauders to a 20-10 record. In 2007, Mary had the best defense in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference as it led the conference in pass defense, only allowing 197.6 yards per game and ranked second in rush defense, giving up just 94.4

Tanager girls' basketball defeats SSC, Madison

Vermillion won its second and third straight games of the girls basketball season, surprising South Sioux City, 57-52, and winning at Madison, 42-37, for a 3-0 record to begin the year.

Coach Nick Mayer's girls will return to action in a girls-boys doubleheader at home against Tea Area next Friday, Dec.

Wins over South Sioux City's legendary girls basketball program come few and far between, but the Tanagers' gutsy fourth-quarter performance under pressure got them one this time in the home opener Dec. 15.

Vermillion secured a one-point lead late in the first quarter, but it was shortlived. The Cardinals took a 22-18 lead at the end of that period and increased that advantage to as many as eight points early in the third quarter and seven points late in the period. But from a 39-33 deficit in the first minute of the final quarter, the Tanagers saw Lexi Regnerus score seven straight points on a twopoint basket, a three-pointer and two free throws. Kelly Amundson's field goal made it 42-39.

South Sioux City tied the game at 42-42, but another Regnerus basket gave Vermillion a lead it would never relinquish.

Fourth-quarter contributions to the VHS cause came from different sources. Josie Huber's basket with 3:53 left gave Vermillion a four-point lead. Strong drives to the hoop in succession by Amundson and Mackenzie Huber made it 50-43 with 2:27 left. After the Cards came back to within four, it was Blair Gilkyson's turn to score with a pair of free throws at the 1:28 mark.

Amundson snatched crucial defensive rebounds following missed Cardinal shots in the final minute. While a pair of three-point baskets kept South Sioux within reach, the Tanagers had their answers at the free-throw line. Gilkyson sank one of two with 1:08 remaining, Amundson sank a pair at 0:55, Gilkyson one more at 0:22 and Amundson one at

Though South Sioux had 20 field goals – nine of them from three-point distance -compared to Vermillion's 16, the Tanagers' play enticed the Cardinals to foul and then made them pay for it at the stripe. VHS sank 22 of 32 free throws while the Cards made only five of nine attempts.

Amundson had a 15-point, 14rebouna performance. Beth Szymonksi had 12 points and 10 rebounds. Regnerus scored 13. Gilkyson and Josie Huber had five points each, Mackenzie Huber four, Val Robinson two and Bailey Carlson one. Morgan Hanson led South Sioux with 14 points.

On Monday night at Madison it was again a case of being able to reach the free-throw line. The Tanagers had 31 opportunities there and made 17 of them while Madison had only seven free throws, succeeding on five.

Amundson and Regnerus led the VHS scoring with 11 and 10 points, respectively.

VHS boys remain undefeated after win over Madison

Vermillion remained unbeaten in boys basketball last Thursday with a 66-53 victory at Madison, the Tanagers' third victory of the young season.

season-opening contests have been Big 8 Conference games, so Vermillion has a 3-0 record in league play with five conference games remaining later in the season.

Each team scored 21 field

goals in the Madison game, but the Tanagers' talent for reaching the free-throw stripe and doing well once they are there again proved valuable. Though only five more fouls were called on the Bulldogs than on Vermillion---22 to 17--nevertheless the Tanagers shot 30 free throws, sinking 23 of them, compared to Madison's seven successful free tosses out of 17 tries.

A balanced scoring attack was another Vermillion asset in picking up Win No. 3. Austin Krier and J.T. Sorensen came home with 12 points each, and Caleb Miller contributed 11. Three players - Nick Jensen, Tanner Settles and Anthony Leber – added seven each to the Tanager total. Tanner Anderson had six and Nile Morecraft four.

After leading by 11-6 at the quarter break and 27-21 at halftime, the Tanagers saw Madison tie the game at 34-34 with 3:14 left in the third period. But Vermillion's immediate response was a 12-3 run for the rest of that period, securing a 46-36 lead. Madison was unable to close the gap significantly the rest of the way. On the boards Vermillion

had a 33-21 advantage. Jensen and Sorensen with seven boards each led that effort, but Morecraft, Settles, Anderson and Leber had four each, Miller two and Krier one.

From his guard spot Anderson assisted on four field goals. Krier had three assists, Settles and Miller two each and Leber one.
