Their first dual of the season out of the way, Vermillion High's gymnasts resume action after an 11-day break Saturday. The Tanager ladies will be at the Wagner Invitational. In the season opener on Nov. 27, Sioux Falls Lincoln came to the VHS gym and went home with a 125.75 to 116.5 victory in

the varsity dual. Vermillion won the junior varsity competition by a margin of 80.15 to 59.85.

Three Lincoln gymnasts went 1-2-3 in the all-around standings among the varsity girls, led by Sydney Torgrude with a 32.75 score. She won the bars and floor exercise events. Vermillion had the fourth, fifth and sixth-place gymnasts--freshman Cheyenne Mallory,

29.79; senior Morgan Hower, 29.7; and senior Rory Tucker, 29.2

Hower was third on the bars at 6.6, sixth on the floor at 7.9 and in a tie for fourth in the vault at 8.2. Mallory placed fifth on the bars at 5.65 and second on the beam at 8.35. Tucker was second in floor exercise at 8.65. Another Tanager, senior Alexis Reich, tied for sixth in the vault at

8.15. Junior Anna Hammond tied for fourth in the vault at 8.2.

Vermillion had the top three gymnasts in the JV all-around standings, led by Anneliese Taggart at 24.35 and followed by Hope Knedler, 22.55, and Brisee Schnack, 19.95.

Taggart won the bars at 2.9, was second on the floor at 6.0, won the beam at 7.5, and won the vault at 7.95. Schnack was

third on the beam, fifth on the floor, second on the bars and fifth in the vault. Knedler was third on bars, fourth on the beam, fourth in the vault and first in floor exercise. Kathryn Farrell placed third in floor exercise, and Reich was second on the beam.

Vermillion wrestlers will compete at Yankton Invite

Vermillion's wrestlers will complete the second week of their season Saturday at the Yankton Invitational.

Next week the Tanagers will make their last home appearance for six weeks when they host Tea Area and West

Central in a triangular on Thursday night.

The VHS matmen opened their campaign on Nov. 27 in a triangular at Lennox where they defeated the host Orioles, 51-30, but lost a dual with Harrisburg, 55-18.

On Saturday at the nine-team Rider Invitational at Sioux Falls Roosevelt, the Tanagers

finished ninth in the team standings with a point total of 103.5

Vermillion did claim two championships, one runner-up, and a pair of fourth-place finishes.

Brett Bye won the title in the 145-pound class, capping off his day with a pin in 3:02 over West Central's Jake Anderson. Regan

Bye followed with the 152-pound championship, besting Brandon Valley's Wyatt Winter, 4-2, in his final match. The Bye cousins are both sophomores.

Brandon Hertz, Vermillion's sophomore 160-pounder, reached his championship match before losing out to Lincoln's Luke Reiter, 5-2. Junior Alex Osborne placed

fourth at 170 when he dropped the third-place contest to West Central's Brandon Pennock, 7-1. Senior Seth Heine took fourth at 182, falling 4-2 in the third-place match to Washington's Dan Marlette.

Defense powers Idaho State past USD

Following a 71-55 victory over Big East Conference stalwart Seton Hall in the Pepperdine Holiday Tournament in Malibu, Calif. on Saturday, the University of South Dakota women's basketball team looked to bring some momentum into Thursday's match-up against Idaho State.

Unfortunately for the Coyotes, the Bengals shut down USD's offensive attack and outscored the 'Yotes 37-23 in the second half on the way to a 69-45 victory at the DakotaDome.

Idaho State, which qualified for last year's NCAA Tournament after winning the Big Sky Conference, opened up a 10-point lead at the half and never trailed after the 12-minute mark.

"They (Idaho State) really executed well in the second half, they were able to hit their shots," USD coach Amy Williams said. "Everything we tried to take away from them

they countered."

The Coyotes, who fell to 2-5 with the loss, did not help themselves by shooting only 26 percent from the field, along with 68 percent from the free-throw line.

"We knew it was going to take a little time with a new team and new system to learn where those scoring opportunities are coming from," Williams added. "But right now we are not executing our offense at a very high level."

After a Nicole Seekamp free throw tied the game at 15-15 with 9:02 remaining in the first half, the Bengals used a 17-7 run to close the first period. Idaho State, now 3-2, carried that energy into the second period of play as they used a 10-3 run in the first three minutes of second-half play to extend their lead to 15 and never led by less than 13 for the remainder of the ball game.

Senior Tempestt Wilson led the Coyotes with 14 points. Junior Polly Harrington added 12 points but was

limited to just 20 minutes of action due to early fouls.

"We need Polly to stay out of foul trouble," Williams said. "She got herself into a position where she had to foul and sit herself on the bench and we can't afford for her to do that."

Freshman Margaret McCloud was the only other Coyote to score more than four points, as she finished the game with seven while adding a team-high nine rebounds.

Idaho State had a trio of players in double figures. Lindsey Reed finished with 20 points while Cydney Horton scored 12 and Kara Jenkins added 10. Ashleigh Vella grabbed a game-high 14 rebounds to go along with her eight points.

The Bengals finished the game shooting 36 percent from the field but they were more successful from behind the three-point line, making eight of seventeen shots (47 percent).
