New Group Of Leaders Works To Add To Program's Four Straight Titles

CROFTON, Neb. - A new wave of leaders is ready for the challenge in this small, northeast Nebraska town.

Their goal? Maintain – and help extend – the Crofton High School girls' basketball tradition. It's a tradition that has seen seven state championships in 11 seasons, including the last four, and a 53-game winning streak entering the season.

It's a task the trio of Breanna Allen, Monica Arens and Kelsey Sanger, among others, is embracing.

"We always want to continue what the girls before us did," said Allen, one of seven seniors on a team that graduated four key players from a 29-0 championship squad

'We've watched that since we were kids," Allen added. "For me as a senior, in my fourth year, I want to go out with a bang."

To get to that point again, however, the Warriors are going to have to replace the production – not to mention adership – of a departed
