GFP Repeals Lease Fee At Cedar Shore Center

PIERRE - The state Game, Fish and Parks Commission decided Thursday to waive the rental fee for the convention center lease next to Cedar Shore resort.

The city of Oacoma has leased the public land since 2004 when the convention center was built along Francis Case Reservoir on the Missouri River.

The lease calls for the city to give 2.5 percent of gross revenue to the Game, Fish and Parks Department but the fee doesn't kick in until the bonds for the center are repaid. Bond repayment is scheduled to be complete in 2020, according to Sean Blanchette, con-

cessions manager for the state parks division. Blanchette said GFP hasn't received any money from the lease.

The fee waiver would run the rest of the lease that expires in 2040. 'They take care of everything," he said.

"How much money we talking here?" commissioner Barry Jensen of White River asked 'Roughly \$12,000 a year," Blanchette replied.

The commission approved removing the fee from the lease on a voice vote without op-

The city lease for the convention center is separate from GFP's lease for the Cedar Shore resort property. The buildings are connected. Both leases run through 2040.

in no-till farming systems in South Dakota acres since the 2013 inventory, and up significantly from 2004. The 2015 inventory found use of no-till cropping systems to be predominant on 46 percent of South Dakota cropland (6.47 million acres). A cropping system that leaves more than 30 percent residue cover on the soil surface after planting (including no-till) was used on more than 65 percent of the state's cropland. For the first time, the overall percentage of acres under conventional tillage was down slightly, however, the location

of those acres shifted. Cropping systems impact the health and productivity of soil—the foundation of South Dakota's agriculture industry. Zimprich says, "This is why NRCS is focusing on helping farmers and ranchers improve the health of their resources. Soil health matters. Healthy soil is the key to the sustainability of our resources, the key to the productivity, profitability and resiliency of our farms and ranches; and it's the key to reducing or eliminating any off-site water quality impacts of agricultural production."

cropping systems include conservation practices such as no-till, diversified cropping rotations and cover crops. The number of counties with more than 75 percent of their cropland acres under a notill system increased from 4 counties in 2004, to 14 counties in 2013, to 17 counties in 2015. While the overall acres under no-till increased, in eastern South Dakota, 8 counties decreased their no-till cropland acres.

Zimprich says, "Using cropping systems that don't disturb the soil, that keep the soil covered, that keep live roots growing year-round, and that use diverse cover crop mixes and crop rotations, are the tools that enable our farmers to improve soil health. Farming leaders across South Dakota like Joel Erickson, who farms in Marshall County, Steve Reimer who farms near Chamberlain, Jorgensen Farms in Tripp County, and Al Miron in Minnehaha County are a few of many who are demonstrating long-term success and profitability with practices that focus on healthy soil."
