Vermillion Powers Past Bon Homme, Roncalli

With last Tuesday's season opening loss behind them the Vermillion High School girls' basketball team won two consecutive games in two consecutive days for a big confidence booster heading into a weeklong break.

Friday night, the Tanagers traveled to Tyndall where they downed the Bon Homme Cavaliers 61-33 then followed that up with a 45-20 win over the Aberdeen-Roncalli Cavaliers at the Tea Area Classic Saturday afternoon.

"I think our girls gained a lot of confidence Friday night," said Vermillion head coach Jon Brooks "After (the loss) Tuesday they were down a little bit and then (Friday) night a lot of kids scored. We had kids who just looked like they were settled in a little better and I think that carried over to Saturday."

At Bon Homme, Vermillion saw points from 11 different players including 10 points from Autumn Barnett and eight from Twila Sweeney, Shantel French, Kasey Jensen and Haleigh Melstad.

"We were able to get off to a quick start," said Vermillion head coach Jon Brooks. "Our pressure defense helped us create turnovers and get transition buckets. I thought we played with good energy, which was a point of emphasis heading into the game. We also had 11 girls score. It is always nice when a lot of kids can get into the game early in the season so we can see them play."

The Tanagers energy, and defensive domination, carried over into Saturday's win when the team turned right around to play their second game in less than 24 hours.

"Our big focus with (Saturday) was the fact that we played (Friday) night, got home

late and had to drive up (to Tea Saturday) morning, so we were really focusing on just being mentally ready to go," Brooks said. "I told the girls right after the game today that I was really proud of them for the fact that we came out ready to play."

we came out ready to play." The Tanagers were more than ready to play and held Aberdeen-Roncalli to just 20 points in the game with the top three Roncalli scorers gaining only four points each.

The Tanagers were familiar with Roncalli's offensive strategy and were able to adjust their defense to match.

"Looking at them coming in, (Aberdeen-Roncalli) runs a really good half court offense, man-to-man," Brooks said. "They run a lot of one-four high sets, a lot of back screens, so we wanted to take them out of their (man-to-man) offense. So, that's why we went zone most of the game. It seemed like we had them confused a little bit and the pressure really worked, so I think it was just the fact of taking them out of what they really wanted to do."

The zone defense worked well enough that each quarter ended with Vermillion ahead by at least 10 points.

Vermillion's offense was equally as dominant as the defense with Barnett and Melstad hitting 12 points each, while Sweeney had eight and Madisen Martinez scored six. Barnett was also 4-for-4 at the free throw line and Martinez was 2-for-2.

"(Barnett and Melstad) are kind of our two big perimeter scoring threats," Brooks said. "Twila did well down low and Kasey (Jensen) got some looks, just missed a few shots, but when we got Kasey and Twila working down low and we got Haleigh and Autumn scoring on the perimeter that makes our offense tough to stop."

Vermillion has a full week to recover and practice on improving their offensive strategy, but jump right back into game play with another set of back-to-back games on Dec. 21-22.

"We need to stir some things up offensively, indefinitely," Brooks said. That was our main focus. A couple of the offenses that we are trying to run, we're just not quick enough with them yet."

On Monday, Dec. 21, the Tanagers tip off against Sioux City North, Iowa at 7 p.m. and return the next day, Tuesday, Dec. 22, against Tri-Valley at 3:45 p.m. Both games are scheduled to be played in Vermillion.

"It's something you tell the girls, you win and you think you did everything right, but you don't" Brooks said. "There are still things to improve on. We still have some things to improve on this week and with playing three games (last) week we haven't had a whole lot of practice time, so next week will be nice for us."
