It was requested to have Johnson Engineering attend next week's meeting to discuss the program.
At 10:15 a. m. the Commissioners acting as Board of Resolutions met on Drainage Permit Application #10-02 Kenken Investments -910 Flint Dr, Storm Lake, IA. 50588, for proposed drainage (tile) in the S1/2 of the NW1/4 of Section 11, Township 95 North, (Glenwood Twp) Range 51 West, of the 5th p.m. to drain into roadside ditch (468th Ave.) North to Ash Creek and into the Vermillion River.

WHEREAS, in 1970, South Dakota Governor Frank Farrar signed and Executive Order creating six Planning and Development Districts in South Dakota; and
WHEREAS, the South Eastern Council of Governments (SECOG) was created when local officials in the area exercised their authority under the Joint Exercise of Governmental Powers (SDCL 1-24); and
WHEREAS, SECOG serves Clay, Lincoln, McCook, Minnehaha, Turner, and Union Counties as well as the municipalities located within those counties in southeastern South Dakota; and
WHEREAS, SECOG was created as a means whereby counties and cities and other public and private organizations within them may cooperate with one another to improve the health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the region; and
WHEREAS, SECOG promotes regional cooperation and economical delivery of services and has been providing technical assistance to local governmental entities for more than 35 years; and
WHEREAS, SECOG's Executive Board has determined that the existing Joint cooperative

agreement entered into in 2006 should be revised.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED
1. The County of Clay hereby approves the document titled "South Eastern Council of Governments Joint Cooperative Agreement" among Clay, Lincoln, McCook, Minnehaha, Turner, and Union counties and the cities of Sioux Falls, Vermillion, and Brandon.
2. The agreement, containing revisions to the existing 2006 Joint cooperative Agreement, is attached to and hereby made a part of this resolution.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session Tuesday, February 2, 2010 at 9:00 a.m. Members present: Kephart, Wilson, Passick, Wilson and Sommervold.
Minutes of the January 26th meeting were amended and approved with a motion by Wilson, seconded by Sommervold and carried.
Kephart moved, seconded by Wilson and carried to approve the agenda.
Rod Polley/ Hwy Superintendent and the Board to discuss highway matters.
Meal expense requested for M.S.H.A. (Mining, Safety, and Health Administration) Training in Vermillion, SD on February 3, 2010. This meeting is an annual safety refresher course, required by liability insurance, held jointly between Clay, Union Counties and City of Vermillion. Kephart moved, seconded by Wilson and carried to approve said request.
Sommervold moved, seconded by Wilson and carried to pass and adopt the Bridge Inspection Resolution #10-08 authorizing Johnson Engineering to inspect certain bridges belonging to Clay County.

RESOLUTION #10-08
BRIDGE RE-INSPECTION PROGRAM RESOLUTION FOR USE WITH SDDOT RETAINER CONTRACTS
WHEREAS, Title 23, Section 151, United States Code and Title 23, Part 650, Subpart C.
Code of Federal Regulations, requires initial inspection of all bridges and re-inspection at intervals not to exceed two years with the exception of reinforced concrete box culverts that meet specific criteria. These culverts are re-inspected at intervals not to exceed four years.
NOW, THEREFORE, The Board of Clay County Commission is desirous of participating in the Bridge Inspection Program using Bridge Replacement funds.
The County requests SDDOT to hire Johnson Engineering, Inc (Consulting Engineers) for the inspection work.
