On the line are berths in next week's state "A" tournament at Aberdeen. The top four placers in each weight class qualify for that event, and those wrestlers will be determined tonight. The regional began with a 5 p.m. session last night (Thursday).

Matmen from Tea Area, Harrisburg, Dakota Valley, Sioux Falls Washington, Brandon Valley, Sioux Falls Lincoln, Yankton, Lennox and Vermillion are competing for the coveted state tourney trips.

For the Tanager wrestlers the

regular season ended with a win and a loss in a triangular at Harrisburg last Friday. The win was a major one, however, as the Tanagers by defeating Harrisburg, 42-30, clinched the Big 8 Conference regular-season duals championship.

Vermillion won seven of the 12 weight classes actually wrestled, and one of the most exciting of those wins came at 138 pounds where Nate Samudzi won his first-ever varsity match with a pin in 4:38 over the Tigers' Matt Hudson.

Kyle Seibel got the ball rolling for VHS with an 8-7 decision over Taylor Dalen at 106 pounds. Carter Kratz won big-time over Bryce Zamora at 120, accumulating points to the tune of 17-1 for a technical fall.

By placing second in the fourschool Region 2A gymnastics tournament at Wagner last Friday, Vermillion's gymnasts qualified as a team for state tournament competition at the Swiftel Center in Brookings today (Friday).

The Tanager team will also be well represented in the Class "A" individual competitions at Brookings Saturday as Vermillion qualified four athletes on the beam, four in floor exercise, three in the vault and three on bars as well as one in the all-around competition.

At the regional Madison won the team title with a 144.200 score, and the Tanagers were next at 121.650. Wagner scored 115.150 and West Central 97.025.

The Tanagers had trailed Wagner by approximately five points in a meet the previous week, so earning the state tournament trip over the Red Raiders by a margin of more than six points made it a superb day for Vermillion gymnasts.

In the all-around competition where the top five advance to state, freshman Jamie Moos earned that fifth and last spot with a 30.725 score.

Tanagers cling to narrow lead in fight for District 8A top seed

Vermillion's girls won two of three games last week, improving their record to 15-3 as they headed to Wagner to face the top-rated Red Raiders Tuesday night in the regular-

As this week began, the Tanagers had a narrow lead over Beresford in the fight for top seed in the District 8A Tournament, which starts with semifinal play Tuesday night. The Watchdogs' final game was against Sioux Falls Christian last night (Thursday). Whichever team finishes with home-court advantage will face No. 4 seed Elk Point-Jefferson while the other will get Dakota Valley in the semifinals.

The district championship game is set for next Thursday at the home court of the higher-seeded participant.

Also left to be determined this week was the Big 8 Conference championship. A Thursday night loss to West Central last week, 47-42, cost the Tanagers a chance for an outright title. But a 56-50 win over Harrisburg the following night left them at 6-2 for the league season. In order for Vermillion to come out with a share of the conference title, West Central (6-1) would have had to lose to Lennox last night (Thursday).

The win over Harrisburg seemed safely certain during the first three quarters Friday, but the Tigers came up with 20 points, including four three-point baskets, in the fourth period to draw to within three points at 53-50 with 26 seconds left. Kelly Amundson sank both ends of a one-and-one opportunity, and Beth Szymonski added one free throw for the final six-point margin.

Earlier VHS had dominated, leading 19-8 after a quarter, 33-18 at the half and 43-30 after three stanzas. One of the evening's great sources of pleasure for Coach Nick Mayer was Blair Gilkyson's 6-of-8 night of field-goal shooting. She finished as high scorer with 15 points. Amundson had 13, Lexi Regnerus contributed nine, Val Robinson seven, Josie Huber and Szymonski five each, and Bailey Carlson and Mackenzie Huber two apiece. Szymonski led rebounders with nine, and Robinson had five assists.

For Harrisburg Morgan Beaner had 14 and Brittany Blakney and Alex Johnson 11 points

Against West Central, who handed VHS two of its losses this year, the Tanagers were cool from the field in the first half, but a 17-7 advantage in the third lifted them into the lead by 33-28. West Central rebounded to finish strong, hitting crucial shots in the fourth

weeks.



The only other VAST swimmer to sweep all of his individual events was 8-year-old




Ten-year-old Anna Van Holland turned in a great meet as well. The second-year swimmer placed first in four out of five events in the day. She
