says a lot about the quality of swimmers we have in Vermillion."

In other VAST achievements, Maddie Lavin currently holds top spots as the fastest swimmer in the State of South Dakota in the 11-12 age group in eight events. Another rising VAST star is Vermillion High School sophomore Jacob Krier, who as of last week, was ranked as one of the fastest swimmers in the state of South Dakota in the 15-16 year-old age group. He is ranked in the top 10 in eight events, and in the top three in the 50, 100 and 200- yard freestyle events

freestyle events. Krier is making a new mark in VAST history this spring. Krier is one of only three male swimmers in VAST history to make the qualifying time to compete in the USA Swimming Speedo Champions Series Meet, which will take place in March in Wisconsin. Krier qualified to compete in the men's 50-yard freestyle with a time of 22.75 seconds. He remains very close to also making the qualifying time for the 100- and 200-yard freestyle events and the 100-yard backstroke.

It's a great achievement, said Moran.

"At the Sectionals meet, Krier will compete against the fastest swimmers from Iowa, Illinois, Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Wisconsin.

"The competition at Sectionals is always very fast," said Moran. "Most of the best swimmers in the region attend the meet. In order to get into the final heats after preliminaries, he will have to swim as fast as some of the best collegiate swimmers around. Even some college swimmers have been known to enter the meet."

The VAST swim season will be wrapping up in the next month. Sixteen VAST swimmers have qualified for state and are expected to compete at the State swim meet this year, to be held March 1 – 3 in Aberdeen. A week later will be the Speedo Sectionals in Wisconsin, followed by Midwest Regional competition toward the end of March.

"The season is going by fast and all of our swimmers are showing great improvement," said Moran. "The coaching staff is very excited for the end of the year meets coming up in the next two months as the team looks to finish the season better than we ever have."
