# Vermillion boys take 2nd in Dakota XII Classic

TEA – The Tangers were matched up against undefeated Madison in the inaugural Dakota XII Conference Classic in Tea on Feb. 8. The Bulldogs (15-0) got out to a fast start, and held on to a 12-point win. Madison remains the only undefeated team in Class A, and lead the Region 3A field. Vermillion still leads Region 4A, just ahead of Canton (11-3)

and Dakota Valley (10-6). Vermillion got off to a slow start, being down 7-18 after the first quarter, and 21-37 at halftime. They made a charge in the third quarter, closing the gap to 41-53 after three quarters. Both teams scored 17 points in the fourth quarter, so that was a wash. Cooper Williams led the Tangers with 18 points, two rebounds and two assists. Jayce Huska added 16 points, three

boards, two steals and three assists. The Bulldogs won the battle of the boards, grabbing 28 rebounds while the Tangers snagged 22. The Tangers had a slim 13-11 edge from the free-throw line, and both teams made five three-pointers. Tyrell Harper added nine points, seven rebounds, one steal and one assist. Nick Jensen also scored none points, grabbed three boards and two steals.

Jeremiah Johnson had three points and one rebound. Carter Andre also added three points, three boards and two assists. The boys next travel to Dakota Valley (10-6) on Feb. 11, then to Wagner (7-8) on Feb. 18. They finish the regular season with a chance at payback by hosting Madison (15-0) on Feb. 20, then travel to Canton (11-3) on Feb. 28.

# Slow start dooms Tanager girls

Not being able to score a single point in the first quarter is very hard to overcome, as the Tangers found out the hard way at the VHS gym Feb. 4. Being down 10-0 after the first quarter, they closed the gap to 20-13 by halftime, and even closer at the end of three quarters, but close doesn't count. "Once again our start did us in," said Coach Jon Brooks. "We didn't score the first quarter and

started off down 10 points and had to battle back the whole game." Vermillion's Haleigh Melstad led all scorers with 15 points, three rebounds and three steals. Josie Huber added 13 points, a game-high 14 rebounds and two steals. "We did a nice job fighting back and even took the lead in the third quarter," said Brooks, "but just spent so much energy doing that, that we couldn't maintain a lead."

The Watchdogs were led by Becca Nelson with 14 points, while Jen Swanstrom added 14 points. "We just didn't play fundamental basketball," said Brooks. "We turned the ball over way too much in order to win." Shantel French scored five points, grabbed two rebounds and one steal. Kasey Jensen added four points, four rebounds, one assist and three steals. Tori Gregoire had three

points and three rebounds. Kyleigh Melstad added two points, five rebound and one assist. Haley Freidel had one point, three rebounds and one assist. "Give Beresford credit," said Brooks, "their kids played hard and executed their game plan. When we get some shots to fall and take care of the basketball we will be a good team. That has to be our focus from here on out."
