Morehead State edges USD

The first true home challenge was nearly a signature victory. Yet, in the end, it was simply a couldhave-been.

In its first home game against a fullfledged Division I opponent, the University of South Dakota men's basketball team saw a nine-point second half lead go by the wayside in a 66-64 loss to Morehead State on Monday night inside the DakotaDome.

Against a Morehead State team with four starters back from last season's run to the NCAA Tournament, the Coyotes (6-5) gave the visitors all they could handle.

"You can always take things away from every game you play, but when you're in a hard-fought game like this, you want to see your guys make that play to win it," said USD coach Dave Boots, whose team had previously hosted North Dakota, Seattle and SIU-Edwardsville since moving to the D-I level.

"We tried the best we could," he added. "It was a super effort by our kids.'

But it was a late charge from the Eagles, coupled with some cold shooting from the three-point and free throw lines by USD, that did in the hosts.

Morehead senior Maze Stallworth hit a go-ahead three-pointer with 1:45 to play, and USD committed two turnovers down the stretch before hitting 1-of-2 free throws with three seconds to play.

A 40-foot three-point attempt at the buzzer by Coyote freshman Jake Thomas clanked off the rim, and the Dome crowd of 1,045 let out a collective breath.

"Games like this just come down to a few plays," said USD senior forward Tyler Cain, who posted 17 points and 15 rebounds. "Whoever gets those breaks on basically jump balls will probably come out on top.

"And they won that battle."

USD slowly built a first-half lead against a physical Morehead State team led by junior forward Kenneth Faried, the nation's second-leading rebounder a year ago. The back-and-forth opening half featured six ties before the Coyotes put together an 11-2 run to go ahead 30-21.

The Covotes led 36-29 at halftime thanks to a 59.3 percent shooting effort from the field.

However, Morehead State used a surge of its own to close the gap
