Duane LeMoyne Iverson was delivered into his mother's arms on Dec. 25, 1928 by Santa Claus, he once said. He left this earth with Jesus on Dec. 21, 2009 just four days before his 81st birthday. His wife Irene and daughter Glenda were at his side, in Palm Desert, CA. Granddaughter Alicia greeted him at heaven's gates where he also joined his parents and his three brothers.

Duane, the son of Lewis C. and Georgia Iverson, grew up in rural Norway Township where he attended Lincoln School. He graduated from Vermillion High School in 1946. CA in 1998. Duane was a wonderful storyteller regaling his children with stories of his childhood, his extended family, and people and events of long ago Vermillion. In his spare time he enjoyed working in his garden in Vermillion or creating lovely pieces of handiwork. He and Irene travelled extensively in their later years, spending many winters in California where they eventually retired. Duane was someone who cared about others and was always willing to help them.

South Dakota receives grant for broadband mapping and planning

today announced that it has awarded 15 grants to fund broadband mapping and planning activities in Arizona, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Michigan, Minnesota, Nevada, North Dakota, Ohio, Oregon, Puerto Rico, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, and Tennessee under NTIA's State Broadband Data and Development Grant Program. The program, funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, will increase broadband access and adoption through better data collection and broadband planning. The data will be displayed in NTIA's national broadband map, a tool that will inform policymakers' efforts and provide consumers with improved information on the broadband Internet services available to

NTIA received applications representing all 50 states, 5 territories, and the District of Columbia to parthat all governments that were eligi-

The Department of Commerce's ble to apply for grants did so, National Telecommunications and whether directly or through a desig-Information Administration (NTIA) nated entity. Twenty-one grants have previously been announced under this program and the agency expects to continue announcing

awards over the coming weeks. NTIA has awarded the South Dakota Bureau of Information and Telecommunications approximately \$1.4 million for broadband data collection and mapping activities over a two-year period and \$500,000 for broadband planning activities over a five-year period in South Dakota, bringing the total grant award to approximately \$1.9 million. The South Dakota Bureau of Information and Telecommunications is the designated entity for the state of South Dakota.

Awardees will collect and verify the availability, speed, and location of broadband across the state. This activity is to be conducted on a semi-annual basis between 2009 and 2011, with the data to be presented in a clear and accessible format to ticipate in the program, meaning the public, government, and the research community.
