or four snowstorms statewide. "It would be comparable to storms in April 1995, March 1985, and January 1949 in average snowfall statewide," said Todey. "Several storms from other years have been worse in certain parts of the state. In the case of this storm,

most of the state saw more than 10 inches of snow. This storm was also less-common time of year for a big snowfall event. When we compared it to about 20 other major snowfall events, only two others occurred in late December/January. Almost all the rest happened between late February and early April, with one recorded in November." Areas around Aberdeen,

Onida, and a few parts of the southwest corner received less than 10 inches, Todey added.

"It was only in the southwest where we missed the major part of the storm, but when you are counting 7-9 inches of snow as the lesser part of the storm, you see how significant it was," Todey said. "The neighboring states received large impacts from this storm as well.
