South Dakota Christmas blizzard ranks in the top three for entire-state snowfall

South Dakota's statewide average snowfall from the recent Christmas blizzard was 15.4 inches.

That's according to preliminary data collected by the National Weather Service across the state, said South Dakota State Climatologist Dennis Todey, who said the widespread nature of the snowstorm made it unique.

"Many locations set snowfall records for individual days during the storm, even though no location set any 24-hour, all-time snowfall record," said Todey. "The snow was spread over a 3-5 day period expanding the period of accumulating snow."

Todey said several stations set all time highs for three-day storm totals, although this category is a less commonly reported. Recorded snowfall for

three-day periods included:

- Belle Fourche, 24 inches
- Pollock, 17 inches
- Sioux Falls, 19 inches
- Vermillion, 23.5 inches
- Yankton, 20.5 inches
- Marion, 23.5 inches
- Clear Lake, 20 inches

The snowfall amounts for Belle Fourche and Pollock were records for those cities. Todey said the other reports would be in the top-five, three-day accumulations at those locations, and that overall, the storm would likely rank historically as one of the top three or four snowstorms statewide.

"It would be comparable to storms in April 1995, March 1985, and January 1949 in average snowfall statewide," said Todey. "Several storms from other years have been worse in certain parts of the state. In the case of this storm,

most of the state saw more than 10 inches of snow. This storm was also less-common time of year for a big snowfall event. When we compared it to about 20 other major snowfall events, only two others occurred in late December/January. Almost all the rest happened between late February and early April, with one recorded in November."

Areas around Aberdeen, Onida, and a few parts of the southwest corner received less than 10 inches, Todey added.

"It was only in the southwest where we missed the major part of the storm, but when you are counting 7-9 inches of snow as the lesser part of the storm, you see how significant it was," Todey said. "The neighboring states received large impacts from this storm as well."

Several areas reported more than 20 inches of snow, especially south and west of Sioux Falls, in the northeast corner around Sisseton and Clear Lake, in central South Dakota near Kennebec and Murdo, and in the northwest corner of Perkins County. "We also saw the usual suspects of heavy snow in the northern Black Hills at Lead and Deadwood," said Todey.

Todey also said that ranking multi-day storms can be difficult, due in part to the lack of statewide data from the early part of the 20th century and because of averaging techniques used. He added that the fact the storm occurred over a holiday like Christmas, the significance of the storm was heightened and will place it as a memorable event for many people.
