AMENDMENT TO CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATION

FOR THE PROPOSED PROJECT AT VERMILLION, SOUTH DAKOTA

The South Dakota Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) issued a Categorical Exclusion published on June 5, 2009 for a proposed project to be conducted by the city of Vermillion, South Dakota. The project described in the Categorical Exclusion Determination involves rehabilitation by lining sanitary sewer pipe in various locations throughout the city. The upgraded lines will replace old mains that are the source of significant infiltration. The city received a \$499,000 Clean Water State Revolving Fund loan (SRF) (3.00% 20 yr.) with \$249,500 of that amount in principle forgiveness through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

The Categorical Exclusion is being amended due to a request from the city of Vermillion to expand the project to line additional pipe within the city. The additional lines are also believed to be the source of infiltration and the city has determined that the collection and treatment systems will benefit from the rehabilitation of these lines. No additional funding will be needed to expand the project.

Listed below are the reasons for granting an amendment to the categorical exclusion:

1. The project involves sanitary sewer or storm sewer within the developed portion of the community.

2. No comments requiring mitigative action were received from any of the five review agencies or through the public participation process.

Comments supporting or disagreeing with this decision may be submitted for consideration by DENR after publication of the Amendment to the Categorical Exclusion Determination. After evaluating the comments received, DENR will make a final decision.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session January 12, 2010 at 9:00 a.m. Members present: Wilson, Passick and Kephart; Powell & Sommer Absent.

Vice Chairman Wilson chaired the following proceedings:

Kephart moved, seconded by Passick and carried to approve the agenda as presented.

Minutes of the January 5, 2010 meeting were approved with a motion by Passick, seconded by Kephart and carried.

WIC patients are holding steady at 333 active patients, and immunizations are down. At the end of December there were 42 flu shots given, which is down from last year due to changes in eligibility.

NOTICE OF PROPERTY TAX INCREASE OF \$800,000

RESOLUTION FOR OPT OUT

THE GOVERNING BOARD OF VERMILLION SCHOOL DISTRICT #13-1 does state that the above said board is unable to operate under the tax limitation measure currently in statute. We therefore OPT OUT of such tax limitation in the amount of \$800,000 starting with calendar year 2010 taxes payable in the calendar year 2011. This opt out will be for 5 years, which will be through taxes payable in the calendar year 2015. This action has been taken by the board and approved by at least a two-thirds vote of the board.

This decision may be referred to a vote of the people upon a petition signed by at least five percent of the registered voters in the district and filed with the governing body within twenty days of the first publication of this decision.

Unless this action is referred to a vote of the people and reversed by such vote, this resolution authorizes the county auditor to spread an excess levy to raise tax dollars in the above stated amount.
