Tanager boys will face ancient rival Friday

First an ancient rival tonight (Friday), and then perhaps the best team to visit the VHS gym in a long time next Thursday – those are the challenges facing the Vermillion's boys basketball team in the coming week, not to mention a side trip to neighbor and rival Elk Point-Jefferson on Tuesday.

Lennox, whom Coach Jay Drake's Tanagers defeated on Dec. 11, pay a return visit to Vermillion tonight. After the EP-J excursion, the Tanagers will be home Thursday against the state's topranked and unbeaten Sioux Falls Christian team.

Vermillion brought a 5-1 record into this week's play, which included a Tuesday date with Bon Homme.

Last Friday the Tanagers and Parkston both brought 4-1 records into their game at the VHS gym, and it was the home team which dominated from the outset. The Tanagers enjoyed a 17-6 lead after the first quarter, 31-21 at halftime and

43-35 after three periods on the way to a 21-point fourth quarter which opened up the final margin to 64-46.

Tanner Anderson had 10 points in the first quarter and Nick Jensen nine in the first half in pacing the Vermillion offense. J.T. Sorensen, who led the team in scoring with 16, had 11 in the second half as the Tanagers went on an 11-3 run to open the final period and sealed the

Anderson finished with 13 points, Jensen and Austin Krier had 11 apiece, Jayce Huska five, Tanner Settles four, and Jeremiah Johnson and Ethan James two each. Also seeing action were Carter Andre, Paul Schwasinger, Jack Brown and Tyler Madsen.

Sorensen had 10 boards, Jensen seven and Anderson six as VHS outrebounded Parkston 35-21. Jensen and Sorensen had three steals each, and Huska, Krier and Settles had three assists apiece. Spencer Lucas led Parkston with 18

points and nine rebounds, and Jalen Hurley scored 11.

Earlier last week the Tanagers won at

West Central, 65-40, in Big 8 Conference play despite losing Anthony Leber for some time due to a hand injury sustained in practice the previous day. Moving into his starting role was Tanner Settles, who responded with a 7-of-10 shooting night from the field and 16

After leading by 17-11 at the quarter and 31-24 at the half, the Tanagers played well at both ends of the court in a 17-5 third quarter that opened up a comfort zone.

Krier and Anderson had 12 points each, Jensen 11, Andre four, Sorensen four, James three and Huska three. In the rebounding department Sorensen was the leader with nine while Jensen had four and Settles and Andre three each. Settles completed his excellent night with three assists and eight steals. Krier, Anderson and Sorensen also had three assists each, and Anderson accomplished three steals.

Cam Stone and Cody Bussell had 10 points each for West Central.

Huber's hot shooting helps Tanagers defeat Parkston 5 VHS grapplers place

Vermillion's Tanager girls accelerated through a torrid first half, survived a sluggish third quarter, then refused to let Parkston back into the game Friday as they won for the second straight night.

Their 57-34 domination of a one-loss Parkston team, preceded by a 53-50 road win at Sioux Falls Christian the previous night, lifted the

Tanagers to a 5-2 record. Josie Huber scored Vermillion's first 10 points herself, 15 in the first quarter and 22 in the first half en route

to a 28-point performance in

leading the VHS offense. Three three-point field goals were part of Huber's smokinghot first period after which the Tanagers led by 18-9. An 8-0 run as halftime approached allowed Vermillion to go from a 10-point lead to a 32-14 margin, and it was 36-17 at the

intermission after Brooke Schwasinger beat the buzzer with two of her 12 points.

Up to that point VHS had shot 61 percent from the field, including five of six from long range, while Parkston was 2-of-11 in its three-point attempts.

While the VHS offense went suddenly cold in the third quarter, Coach Nick Mayer's athletes still made their defensive stops at the other end and forced Parkston into taking tough shots. At one point when

the Tanagers led 42-20, Parkston tried to go on a run of its own, getting to within 18 but then missing three straight threepoint attempts which, if successful, might have put some pressure on the Tanagers. But it was still 42-27 after three periods.

Neither team could connect on short shots as the final stanza began, and VHS had scored just six points over a 10-
