BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the property owner shall, at their own expense, repair the sidewalk according to the specifications filed in the office of the City Engineer. The repairs must be completed by the 30th day of June, 2015, or be under contract to be completed no later than the end of 2015. A no cost permit is required to be filed at the City for any repairs performed to the sidewalks. This permit is required to be filled whether the owner is performing the work himself, hiring a contractor to complete the work or electing to have the City perform the work. The permits will be due to the City no later than June 30, 2015.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if a property owner does not repair their sidewalk properly within the time specified, the City of Vermillion will cause the repairs to be made and assess the costs, plus a fiscal fee. The fiscal fee will be EIGHT PERCENT (8%) of the cost or FIFTY DOLLARS (\$50.00), whichever is greater.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the assessment shall be payable in two (2) equal annual installments. Any assessment or installment not paid within THIRTY (30) days after filing the approved assessment roll in the Finance Office shall be collected under Plan One, collection by the County Treasurer, as set forth in SDCL 9-43, and that all deferred payments shall bear interest at the rate of TEN PERCENT (10%) per annum.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any person interested may appear and show cause, before the Governing Body of the City of

**DIVORCE SUMMONS**

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THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA SENDS GREETINGS TO THE ABOVE-NAMED DEFENDANT Mitchell Douglas Turner:

You are hereby summoned and required to answer the Complaint of the above-named Plaintiff, which was the 16th day of December, 2013, filed in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of the First Judicial circuit in Vermillion, Clay County, South Dakota, and to serve a copy of your answer to said Complaint on the undersigned at his office of 106 West Main, PO Box 32, Beresford, South Dakota, within thirty (30) days after the service of this summons upon you, exclusive of the date of such service, and if you fail to answer within said time, the Plaintiff in this action will take judgment against you by default as requested in Plaintiff's Complaint, after thirty (30) days have elapsed from the completed service of said Summons and Complaint.

That pursuant SDCL 25-4-33.1, and until further order of the court, both the Plaintiff and Defendant named herein are restrained from the following:

1. From transferring, encumbering, concealing or in any ways dissipating or disposing of any marital assets without the written consent of the other party or an order of the court, except as may be necessary in the usual course of business or for the necessities of life, and requiring each party to notify the other party of any proposed extraordinary expenditures and to account to the court for all extraordinary expenditures made after the temporary restraining order is in effect; and;
2. From molesting or disturbing the peace of the other party, and;
3. From removing any minor child of the parties from the State without the written consent of the other party or an order of the court.
4. In compliance with the Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction Act, Plaintiff States:
  - a. That the child know as Isabella Mary-Margaret Myers currently resides with Plaintiff at her address of 46766 302nd Street, Beresford, South Dakota 57004.
  - b. No other action concerning the custody of the child is pending in this or any other state other than in this action between the parties hereto.
  - c. No other party has claimed a right to the custody of the child, and no other person not a party to this proceeding has claimed a right to visitation privileges with said child at the time of the signing of this complaint.
5. Pursuant to SDCL 25-4A-11 upon the filing of a summons and complaint for divorce the Plaintiff shall also file and serve upon the Defendant a copy of the standard parenting guidelines. The stan-

ard guidelines attached to the summons shall become an order of the court upon fulfillment of the requirements of service. Any minor child of the marriage shall remain in the custody for the majority of the time in the twelve months preceding the filing of the summons and complaint, unless the parties agree otherwise. The standard guidelines shall apply and continue in effect, unless the parties agree, or the court orders otherwise. Imposition of the standard guidelines creates no presumption as to who may be awarded custody at any hearing.

**Governor appoints two to panel**

PIERRE — Gov. Dennis Daugaard has chosen two men to fill vacancies on the state Transportation Commission.

Larry Thompson, CEO of Vantage Point Solution telecommunications company at Mitchell, will succeed Kevin Schieffer of Sioux Falls.

Schieffer resigned earlier this year to accept an appointment from the governor to the state Board of Regents. The remainder of the term expires in April 2016. Tim Dougherty, a Sioux Falls lawyer, will succeed Mike McDowell, who retired earlier this year from his job as CEO for Heartland Consumers Power District at Madison.

**MBB: Youngstown State 85, USD 59**

Youngstown State jumped out to a 32-9 lead, had three players score at least 17 points and cruised to an 85-59 win against the University of South Dakota Sunday at Beeghly Center in the first-ever meeting between the two programs.

The Penguins improved to 9-6 in non-conference play. They begin Horizon League play Thursday at Milwaukee. The Coyotes have lost six in a row to fall to 3-9. All but three of those games have been

played outside of Vermillion. USD will play its first five games of 2014 inside the DakotaDome starting with Cal State Northridge Thursday at 7 p.m.

Kamren Belin made five three-pointers and scored a game-high 21 points to lead Youngstown State. Shawn Amiker made 8 of 9 shots and scored 20 points. Kendrick Perry scored 16 of his 17 points in the first half and saw limited time in the second.

Trey Norris and Tyler Flack registered season highs of 16 and 12 points, respectively, to lead USD. Flack made all five shots he took. The rest of the team combined to make 15 of 52 shots for 28 percent shooting.

Youngstown State made 10 of 24 three-pointers and shot 48 percent from the field overall. The Penguins also stole 12 passes, blocked eight shots and forced 19 turnovers.

**Delta Dental pledges \$300k toward Feeding SD**

Delta Dental of South Dakota has made a gift of \$300,000 to Feeding South Dakota's \$6 million statewide capital campaign, "Hand to Hand," which kicked off last month in Rapid City. The financial commitment has been pledged in a way that encourages donors from across the state—and country—to join Delta Dental in ensuring that Feeding South Dakota reaches its statewide campaign goal over the next few years.

"Delta Dental has a responsibility to improving the oral health of all South Dakotans. Nutrition plays a large part of that," said Scott Jones, CEO of Delta Dental. "Feeding South Dakota has been a tremendous partner throughout the years—and does a fantastic job of engaging other people and agencies in ensuring that food gets to the people who need it most in an efficient manner. We are proud to support this critical effort in our state."

Jones said that the addition of mobile dental initiatives like Delta Dental's Dakota Smiles Program has shown the company how important access to nutrition is to families—and in particular young people—across the state, especially in rural communities that often don't have easy access to food and health care.

"One of our values is compassion, and I think all South Dakotans can agree that kids deserve to get a fair start in life," Jones also said. "If a child doesn't have food, shelter, clothing and a good education, they face an uphill battle

throughout their life. The more we can do—as individuals, as a company and as a state—to help every child get a good start, the better our society will be."

"Delta Dental has been an important collaborator for Feeding South Dakota over the years," said Matt Gassen, executive director of Feeding South Dakota. "Their support philanthropically has made a difference on thousands of lives across our state. So too has their commitment to taking action—whether by volunteering at our food pantries or by sitting around the table coming up with innovative ideas to solve issues of hunger and nutrition in our state. We are all better because of their commitment to eliminate hunger."

Jones added that it is inspiring to see community leaders like Dale and Patricia Larson and their family support the campaign through volunteer leadership and the historical \$1 million gift they made to the campaign at the beginning of the month. Connie Halverson, vice president for public benefit at Delta Dental, also currently serves on the board of directors for Feeding South Dakota.

The \$300,000 gift from Delta Dental has been pledged in a creative way to engage other individuals, organizations and companies to be part of the \$6 million campaign. \$100,000 was given in November to start the campaign. An additional \$100,000 will be donated after Feeding South Dakota reaches its goal of \$2

million for the Rapid City portion of the initiative. The final \$100,000 will be given once the campaign reaches \$4 million in contributions.

The gift comes on the heels of a year of giving by Delta Dental. In celebration of Delta Dental's 50th anniversary, employees were each given \$1,000 to give to a nonprofit organization of their choice through a project called, "We Give." Nearly \$90,000 dollars was donated to 68 nonprofits, including Feeding South Dakota, across the state.

"We have received a tremendous outpouring of support since announcing this campaign at the beginning of November," Gassen added. "We are focusing on our deadline to meet the John T. Vucurevich Foundation match, and look forward to working with individuals and companies to complete this first portion of the campaign."

To date, Feeding South Dakota has raised \$363,000 toward the John T. Vucurevich Foundation challenge to raise \$500,000 by December 31, 2013. In total, \$1.8 million has been raised for the Rapid City initiative—leaving less than \$200,000 to complete the Rapid City goal.
