Vermillion's Carter Andre had 8 points and five rebounds. Cooper Williams scored 7 points, grabbed two boards and had four assists. Paul Schwasinger added 5 points and one assist. Jeremiah Johnson also had 5 points and one steal, while Jacob Manger scored two points.

The Tanagers won the battle of the boards 29-24. Both teams made 14 shots from 2-point range, while the Huskies had a 10-9 edge from behind the arc. The big difference came from the charity stripe. EPJ shot 7 of 18 (38 percent) for freethrows, while Vermillion was 18 of 24 (75 percent).
