Depleted Post 1 battles in Brookings

The next stop for Post 1 was a tournament in Brookings the weekend of June 22 featuring top teams from around South Dakota and Minnesota.

The tournament's strong competition as well as a few key players absent from the Post 1 lineup was a damaging combination and led to a 1-2 record for Vermillion in the tournament that was shortened due to rain.

Post, 1 0; Coon Rapids, MN, 2 Game one last Friday, June 21,

looked to be a David vs. Goliath battle as Post 1 battled a powerful team from Coon Rapids.

To make matters worse, starters and major producers for the Vermillion offense Chayse Meierkort, Tanner Anderson, and Jayce Huska were all absent in various commitments.

But Post 1 put up quite a fight behind a gem by Jake Odens. Making his first legion appearance of the season, Odens pitched all six innings and quieted the powerful Coon Rapids offense with five strikeouts and no walks.

Coon Rapids managed to string together three, two-out hits in the

fifth to plate their only two runs of the game.
