USD Cross Country announces schedule

Trips to rivals North Dakota State and South Dakota State, a Dakota Days open race, and an early look at the Midwest Regional course in Peoria, IL, highlight the 2014 cross country schedule released today by head coach Dan Fitzsimmons.

Returning for the Coyote men are All-Summit League runners Mubarik Musa (2nd, 2013) and Brant Haase (7th, 2013). On the women's side, the Coyotes will look to the leadership of juniors Amber Eichkorn, Kate Kaster and Katie

The trio were among the University of South Dakota's top 5 a year ago, each placing in the top-20 at the Summit League Championships. Both programs will rely on a strong contingent of freshman to step up as they combined to lose nine seniors from a year ago.

The season begins with a trip north on I-29 to Fargo on Aug. 29 for the NDSU Bison Invitational. The meet will be scored as a tripledual against North Dakota State, North Dakota and South Dakota State. The following weekend on Sept. 5 the Coyotes will run after dark in the Augustana Twilight

After a two-week hiatus, USD will race four consecutive weekends. The teams will race at the Roy Griak Invitational on Sept. 27 and the SDSU Classic on Oct. 4.

On Oct. 10, the Friday of Dakota Days, the men's and women's teams will run in the Charlie's Dakota Days 5k Open against alumni, fans and area runners. The meet will be used as a fundraiser for South Dakota's cross country and

track & field programs.
On Oct. 17 the Coyotes will take an early look at the regional course when they compete in Bradley's "Pink" Classic.

North Dakota State will host the Summit League Championships in Fargo on Nov. 1. South Dakota will look to improve on its performance from a year ago, where the Coyotes had six All-Summit League performers while finishing second on the men's side and third on the

USD will return to Peoria, IL, on Nov. 14 for the NCAA Midwest Regionals. Should either the men or women finish in the top three at that meet or receive a wildcard bid, they would advance to the NCAA National Championships held in Terre Haute, IN, on Nov. 22.

Upward receives Coach Kritenbrink returns from Team USA experience

Like many Americans, USD senior outside hitter Kendall Kritenbrink has worn red, white and blue over the past few weeks. But unlike her peers, she wore the colors on a Team USA uniform.

Kritenbrink was one of 36 athletes invited by USA Volleyball to practice and compete as a member of the U.S. Collegiate Team from June 22-30 in Minneapolis. The athletes participated in a training camp, which doubled as a second tryout for the U.S. University of Minnesot They were then split into teams of 12 to compete against each other during the U.S. Junior National Volleyball Championships.

"The practices, games and even conversations were so intense,' Kritenbrink said. "I have never been a part of anything like it before. Wearing a USA jersey with my name on the back was

such an honor. There was a higher expectation of you with USA written on the jersey and I won't ever

forget that feeling."
With only 36 players
being evaluated compared to 248 during the first tryout in February, Team USA coaches were freed up to give more one-on-one instruction. That gave coaches more time to evaluate Kritenbrink on her game.

"They would pull you aside and give you some tips about different skills," said Kritenbrink. "One skill they worked with me on was my serve. They tried a few different techniques throughout the week. They also focused on my transitioning and approach when attacking because I was a little early at times, causing my attack to not be as

aggressive as possible." After the camp's conclusion, Kritenbrink

was placed on Team Red. Most of her teammates were All-Americans, national championship game participants or had NCAA Tournament appearances. She said each player on the team had interesting stories, but her teammates were intrigued by hers.

"Everyone made South Dakota out to be some foreign country that they had never heard of. I am pretty sure my team believes that I drive a tractor," Kritenbrink said.

Outside of practices, ritenbrink spent time exploring campus, making trips to a nearby Walgreens for snacks and getting to know teammates. The coaches also took the team to the Mall of America on a day off from competition. Those times helped build some of the best parts of her trip.

"The most memorable part of the trip was building the friendships

with all of my teammates," said Kritenbrink. "I can honestly say that I will keep in contact with all of those girls and my coaches. I can't wait to follow everyone throughout the fall and see their successes."

Those times transitioned to some success on the court. Red went 2-2 during the tournament, beating White both times and losing to Blue in the championship. Kritenbrink was pleased with her performance and felt like she was playing with girls she had known forever. She also had a great time interacting with the fans at the matches.

Kritenbrink ranks second on USD's all-time kills list with 1,426 kills and is 25 away from setting the school record. She and the Coyotes will begin the 2014 season on Aug. 29 against Arizona at a tournament in Green Bay, WS.
