but we got the movie from the library and watched that, and we kind of got a basic idea. After learning more about the musical, I knew I wanted to try out for Oliver."

Director Callie Hisek discovered during auditions that Ella possesses all of the qualities needed to successfully portray the orphan boy.

"I was looking for someone who could be both outgoing and shy at the same time, because Oliver has to play both of those," she said. "It was really important when I was looking at all of the kids that were auditioning, to find someone who would have the strength and the maturity, because this is not an easy show for a child.
