# Science camp sheds light on variety of topics

More than 40 students came to the University of South Dakota last week because of one thing: An interest in science.

The annual Lawrence Brothers Science Camp was held July 13-18 for students entering seventh, eighth and ninth grades, at which time they took part in activities under the overall theme, "Light and Vision."

"What we're hoping for is continued interest in science," said camp director Barb Goodman. "The reason why there aren't any requirements for the camp is we freely give scholarships, so whereas many camps you go to you have to be rich or really, really smart to go, we just want kids that are interested in science, and it doesn't matter whether they can afford it or not."

To foster those interests, the students performed a number of different activities, during which they learned about the physiology of vision, eye tracking, color blindness, spectroscopy and lasers.

They also designed robots, had a video conference about dark matter with the Sanford Underground Science Lab and dissected cow eyes.

The last item was the favorite of 14-year-old Sioux Falls resident Ryleigh Turner.

"(I liked) how everything looked, and how it felt," she said. "I was the only one who did it with my bare hands, so it was pretty fun."

The camp is held each year with a rotating theme. "We have three different themes, but the

kids can only come for three years, so we rotate the themes so they could do them all if they wanted," Goodman said. "When we do a theme, we do physiology, biology, chemistry, physics, math

– we do lots of different

variations, lots of

different sciences and math are part of the theme."

Hunter Schopene, of Winner, has attended for the past two years.

"It's a great camp," he said. "I just like how each year the theme changes, so it doesn't get boring doing the exact same thing."

Goodman said there are a number of returning campers each year.

"We had one kid this year who just finished her third year at the camp, and her older sister had already come for three years. She wants to fail ninth grade so she can come back next summer," Goodman said.

Turner said this was her first year as a camper, and she enjoyed it a lot.

"It was the best camp I've ever been to," she said.

The Lawrence Brothers Science Camp was founded in 2002 through a donation from the John and Amy Bowles Lawrence Foundation and support from the University of South Dakota Foundation.

From 2006 through 2011, the camp received grant support from Battelle.

The camp currently is supported by fees and the South Dakota Biomedical Research Infrastructure Network.

The camp is coordinated by Sally Stoll.
