Post 1 cruises to 13-3 win over Yankton

Twenty Vermillion batters strode to the plate in the first two innings as Post 1 built an early 9-0 lead, then cruised to a seven-inning 13-3 win over Yankton in a Tuesday night game shortened due to the 10-run rule.

Post 1 not only took advantage of eight walks in those first two innings but also pounded Yankton pitching for six hits in those two stanzas and 14 hits in all in posting its ninth win against five defeats so far this season.

Sam McBride had a career night of four hits, was on base all five times he batted and drove in five runs. Kyle Nemec, Andrew Eidem, JR Moore and Brian Hansen had two hits each while Jason Rasmussen and Grant Lueders each contributed a hit.

Nemec pitched the first five innings for Vermillion, allowing a single run in the fourth and two in the fifth. He struck out two and walked none. Nick Anglin relieved for the sixth and the seventh, gave up one hit, fanned one and also walked none.

McBride ignited a 12-batter, six-run first inning with a ringing double. Rasmussen laid down a picture-perfect sacrifice bunt to advance McBride to third from where he scored on a wild pitch. Cory Taggart's walk was cashed in on a booming home run blast by Nemec into the trees behind right field, and the inning game for Vermillion and finished

Eidem scored on the tail end of a double steal, and two more runs crossed on bases-loaded walks.
