Teeners finally get to play at home this weekend

After a week in which they posted a 5-2 record, Vermillion's varsity Teeners, after playing their first 13 games on the road, are finally getting some home cooking this weekend.

Coach T.J. Beacom's Teeners were to host Elk Point-Jefferson last night (Thursday), then on Saturday will entertain Beresford at 10:30 a.m. and play either Canton or Dakota Valley at 3:30 or 6 p.m., depending on earlier results. The Teeners will also be home Monday against South Sioux City at 6 and 8 p.m.

Regan Bye was winning pitcher and Colin Olson earned a save as Vermillion won at Beresford, 14-13. Seth Heine drove in four runs, and Ty Iverson had two hits and two RBIs.

In the first of four weekend games at South Sioux City, the Teeners led Wisner-Pilger 3-1 after five innings, but the opponents scored nine times in the final two innings for a 10-6 win. Jack Brown and Peter Haught each drove in a pair of runs, and Iverson and Ryan Schuster, who did the Vermillion pitching, had one RBI each.

The Teeners trailed every minute of Saturday's game against Bennington, NE, until it ended. With the score tied at 5-5 in the bottom of the seventh and two out with nobody on base, Brown set the table, and Ben Houser cleared it off. Brown's triple put the winning run at third base, and seconds later Houser laced a clean single to center field to win it, 6-5. Heine, Houser and Olson each had two RBIs, and Houser and Olson each had three hits.

After succumbing to the Sioux Falls Cyclones 20-0 on Sunday morning, the Teeners rebounded against South Sioux City with a 13-7 triumph that included a 10run fifth inning. Olson struck out six in his complete-game pitching win. Heine had three hits and an RBI, Iverson and Justin Bendesky two hits and two RBIs and Haught a triple and one RBI. Heine, Iverson and Bendesky all scored twice. Vermillion won a twinbill

vermillion won a twinbill at Lennox Monday. In the 20-9 opener, Bye was winning pitcher. Haught's three-run homer lifted Vermillion to an 18-9 lead in the fifth inning. Iverson drove in three runs with three hits, Heine hit safely twice and Travis Weber had two hits, including a tworun double in the first inning that got his team off to a fast 5-0 start.
