Vermillion Teeners extend winning streak

Vermillion's varsity Teeners swept South Sioux City Monday night to extend their winning streak to six.

The string of wins includes a championship in their own four-team tournament played here Saturday.

The Teeners' full schedule continues at Hartington at 5 p.m. Sunday, at home against Dakota Valley Monday, at Parker Wednesday and at home against Canton next Thursday.

With the temperature in the 90s and not a hint of a breeze in the air at Prentis Park Monday night, Vermillion scored 28 runs in seven innings of batting in a doubleheader sweep over South Sioux City, pounded out 18 hits and were handed 13 walks, six hit batters and more wild pitches than can be counted. But they also gave up 18 runs and still won twice, 14-11 in five innings and 14-7 in four innings.

In the first game Vermillion broke a 3-3 first-inning tie with a four-run second in which Colin Olson, Jack Brown and Justin Bendesky had RBI hits. In a five-run third Peter Haught's tworun double, Olson's RBI single and a two-run hit by Ty Iverson produced scores. But South Sioux City kept chipping away, and a two-run double by Haught in the fourth which made the score 14-9 later proved important as the visitors closed to within 14-11 and had the tying run in the on-deck circle as the game ended.

Winning pitcher Regan Bye threw 3plus innings, and Jake Odens and Olson each pitched one frame.

Haught finished with three hits and four RBIs. Olson and Ben Houser each had two hits, and Olson and Iverson each had a pair of RBIs.

The second game was 6-6 after two innings, but a nightmarish third saw



Vermillion send 14 batters to the plate. Five of them walked, three were hit with pitches, and two - Iverson and Bendesky - smoked two-run hits. They and Jay Munger had two hits each in the game, accounting for all six Vermillion base knocks. Bendesky had four RBIs and Munger and Iverson three each.

Ethan James pitched one inning plus five batters in the second, and Bendesky threw three innings. Each of them allowed only one hit.

Saturday's tourney play began with a 10-5 win over Beresford behind Jacob Odens' complete-game effort. He struck out six.

Brown hit safely twice and scored twice. Travis Weber stroked a bases-

clearing double. Olson had an RBI triple, Seth Heine a two-run single and Bendesky and Houser RBI doubles.

In the championship game Vermillion downed Dakota Valley 6-2 behind Olson's complete-game six-hitter. He struck out four and allowed only one earned run.

Haught led the offense with three hits and a run batted in. Brown had two hits, including an RBI double. Heine also doubled home a run, and Olson had an RBI single.

Last Wednesday the Teeners split a twinbill at Wakefield, NE. Odens took the loss in the 5-3 Wakefield win in the opener. Olson had two hits, and Bendeskys cored twice.

USD women's soccer announces 2012 schedule

Grove wins pole vault at USA Juniors

University of South Dakota women's soccer coach Mandy Green has announced the Coyotes' 2012 season schedule. Seven home games highlight the upcoming campaign for the Coyotes.

After playing at Northern Iowa and Nebraska-Omaha for exhibition games, the Coyotes will make their regular-season debut on Aug. 17 at Gonzaga for a 6 p.m., Central time contest in Spokane, WA. The Coyotes will conclude the weekend trip with a game at Idaho on Aug. 19.


USD's home debut is set for Aug. 26 against North Dakota (1 p.m. start). The game is part of a three-game homestand which includes contests against Creighton (Aug. 28) and the College of St. Mary (Sept. 2).

The Coyotes then begin a season-long stretch of seven consecutive road games, which will complete the month of September. South Dakota will play nonconference games at Drake (Sept. 7), Green Bay (Sept. 9), Loyola-Chicago (Sept. 14), Northern Illinois (Sept. 16) and Iowa State (Sept. 23) before opening Summit League play on Sept. 28 at IUPUI. The Coyotes wrap up the month at Western Illinois (Sept. 30) for another conference contest.

USD returns home on Oct. 5 to play host to Nebraska-Omaha, which starts another three-game homestand. The Coyotes will also play host to Indiana-Purdue-Fort Wayne (Oct. 12) and Oakland

(Oct. 14) as part of that stretch. The Coyotes hit the road for games at North Dakota State (Oct. 19) and South Dakota State (Oct. 21) before concluding the regular season on Oct. 27 at home against Missouri-Kansas City.

The Summit League tournament is set for Nov. 8-10 in Brookings. The winner of that event earns an automatic berth to the NCAA tournament. USD is eligible for the Summit League and NCAA tournaments for the first time in 2012.



The 2012 season will mark USD's first season of eligibility for the Summit League and NCAA tournaments. The top four teams in the Summit League regular-season standings earn a trip to the postseason conference tournament, with the winner of the event earning the league's automatic berth to the NCAA tournament.

USD, entering its fifth season under Houk's guidance, opens the season on Aug. 24-25 at the Alabama State tournament in Montgomery, AL. The Coyotes will face Tennessee State, Stetson, Jacksonville State and Southeastern Louisiana at the event.

A week later, the Coyotes will head north to compete at the North Dakota tournament on Aug. 31-Sept. 1 in Grand Forks, ND. The Coyotes will square off against UND, Stephen F. Austin and Green Bay at the tournament. The Coyotes' final pre-

conference tournament is set



State and Jackson State during the two-day tournament.

South Dakota opens Summit League play on Sept. 14 at Western Illinois, with another match at IUPUI set for the next night.

The Coyotes' home debut is set for Friday, Sept. 21 against IPFW, and they will follow with a home match against Oakland on Sept. 23. After a brief trip out of conference to face Creighton on Sept. 25, the Coyotes will return home on Sept. 29 to face Summit League foe UMKC.

South Dakota returns to the road on Oct. 5 to play at North Dakota State, and follows with a match at in-

(Oct. 12) and Western Illinois (Oct. 14) before going on the road to play at Oakland (Oct. 19) and IUPUI (Oct. 20). South Dakota plays host to Nebraska-Omaha on Oct. 22 and closes out the month of October at UMKC on Oct. 26.

The home season concludes for the Coyotes on Nov. 2 and 4 when they play host to SDSU and NDSU, respectively. The regular-season concludes on Nov. 10 at Nebraska-Omaha.

The Summit League tournament, with the site to be determined, will be Nov. 16-17.
