Tanager tennis competes at State

RAPID CITY – The Tanager's tennis team traveled to Rapid City to compete in the State Tennis Tournament 22-24 May. Vermillion brought home no hardware, but they did put up a fight against some major powerhouses on the court.

Sioux Falls Lincoln won the team title with 696 points, followed by Mitchell (577), Sioux Falls O'Gorman (571), Sioux Falls Washington (494), and Rapid City Stevens (384) to round out the top five teams. Vermillion finished in eighteenth place with 15 points, beating both Milbank and Spearfish in the standings.

Jensen wins first in shot put at State

MADISON/SIOUX FALLS – A Vermillion senior saved his best performance of the season for when it really mattered. Having a season best mark of 52'11" to qualify in second place in the shot put behind Canton's Tyler Lems, he was launching his efforts just before Lems all morning.

Coming back from an injuryplagued junior campaign, Nick Jensen has been in the mix all of this season. "I knew I could be right there with him, but I never thought about it until now," Jensen said. "But now it feels

The winning throw came on Jensen's final attempt in the prelims, landing over a foot farther than his season best qualifying distance. The toss of 53'11.5" bested Lems' best effort by only half an inch.

"I knew I'd have to throw good just to beat him," said Jensen. "He's a great thrower, but I had a good week of practice."

Jensen said that his nerves helped him prepare to put the shot. "I was really focused for State, but sometimes you need those (nerves) to throw well," he said. "It gives you a faster twitch, and that gets me going."

"Nick's win was a long time in coming," said Coach Lenni
Billberg. "He battled back from surgery last year to outlast a very talented thrower from Canton in Tyler Lems. I am going to miss the big man a lot in the years to come."

Jensen scored all 10 of the Tanager's team points with his victory in the shot put. He finished in 10 place in the discus on Saturday in Sioux Falls with a toss of 138'0". The discus was won by Lems with a toss of 169'7".

"We had a great state meet," said Billberg. "Our kids all ran close to or better than their best all-time."

The boys' 1600-meter Sprint Medley Team did not fare so well on Friday. Jeremiah Johnson, Rylan Pratt, Jon Rosales and Parson Covington completed the four laps in 3:59.90 to finish in 16th place. They were unable to make it out of the preliminaries, but with two sophomores, an eighth-grader and a seventh-grader, the future looks promising for this team. Custer won the finals on Saturday with a time of 3:38.43.

"Our boys Medley ran well with our third 800 runner filling in," Billberg said. "A seventh-

grader, Parson Covington, had a 4 second PR (personal record) in his 800. The other boys also ran well. The exciting part for them and the girls as well we bring back all of our runners! Tanager track's future is bright!"

An athlete who will have another chance – or four as a matter of fact – to win a track title is eighth-grader Maddie Lavin. On Saturday in Sioux Falls, the Tanager standout finished third in the 1600-meter run (5:11.99), one-hundredth of a second behind runner-up Marion Hohn from Hill City. Madison's Hailey Streff won in a time of 5:08.78.

The scoreboard originally showed identical times for Lavin and Hohn, according to Gayville-Volin's standout Laura Nelson, who had won second place in the Class B 1600 just minutes before.

"The scoreboard then went black (for the official review)," said Nelson, "then a few minutes later, the times came back up showing Maddie was awarded third place. It was a very exciting finish."

"When you're that close in the mile, it's exciting," said Lavin. "To know you're right there, it's good motivation to keep trying harder.

"Maddie Lavin had an amazing meet," said Billberg. "She ran three races on a hot Friday and came out blazing in the mile a seven second PR and school-record-breaking third place."

Lavin helped score all 18 points for the girls' team. Along with her third-place finish in the 1600, she also placed third in the 3200-meter run on Friday in Madison with a time of 11:49.85. Madison's Hailey Streff also won this race in a time of 11:32.06, and Mattie Fairburn of Lead-Deadwood came in second with a time of 11:42.00.

Lavin also anchored the 1600 Sprint Medley Relay. The team of Ashley Schulz, Sydney Peters, MaKenna Koble and Lavin finished second (4:23.17) in heat one on Friday in Madison to qualify for Saturday's finals.

"In the Medley she (Lavin) and her teammates ran faster than all other Tanagers in history," said Billberg. "The time they broke included the great Alicia Brown! These girls have so much potential."

In a record-setting final, Sioux Falls Christian broke the 1984 State A Meet record held by Custer (4:15.30) by completing the two 200-meter legs, the 400-meter leg, and the 800-meter leg in 4:14.72.

Madison finished in second in 4:17.24, with Vermillion, running out of lane 6, securing third in 4:18.90. The Tanagers improved on their time from the prelims by another 4.27 seconds to show how they peaked at the right time of year.

"It all started though with our prelim medley, said Billberg. "The girls on that team were Ashley Schulz, Sydney Peters, Makenna Koble, and Maddie Lavin. They ran a season PR of seven seconds in prelims, and then ran even faster with the addition of Rachel

Finnegan in the finals".

Junior Rachel Finnegan came very close to earning an individual medal in the 400-meter Dash on Friday in Madison. Lowering her qualifying time by over a second, she finished in tenth place with a time of 1:02.51. The last qualifying time for the finals was 1:01.53, just 98-hundredths of a second faster than Finnegan.

Miranda Velgersdyk of Sioux Falls Christian won the 400-meter final in 56.95 seconds. The Meet record set in 2006 by Vermillion's Alicia Brown (0:56.69) stays safe for another year.

The 4x400 Relay team of Rachel Finnegan, Sydney Peters, Katie Kost and MaKenna Koble were just five seconds out qualifying for the finals. Their preliminary time 4:22.05 on Friday left them in ninth place, and watching Saturday's final won by Sioux Falls Christian, who broke the four-minute barrier in a record setting time of 3:59 5?

The boys' team title was claimed by Custer with 103 points, while the girls' title went to Sioux Falls Christian with 119 points. The combined crown went to St. Thomas More, runner-up in the girls' competition (98) and fourth in the boys race (57).

The Tanagers finished in nineteenth place with 10 points in the boys contest, while the girls' took fourteenth place with 18 points.
