required in the case an emergency does arise. It would also help the emergency responders in that situation respond appropriately. "If emergency services

personnel receive a call for an address and are aware there may be a number of children, or individuals for that matter, in the home, they would be able to call in for additional assistance to provide adequate care," Sherlock said.

Currently, the city has no records of where daycares are located, and officials agree the registration will aid emergency workers.

"By word of mouth we know some of the daycare providers, but not all of them." Powell said. "But. if the fire department knows where the child facilities are, they could see there are children there and their actions may be different."

If a daycare is licensed by the state, it will still need to be registered with the city; though will not be required to undergo inspections by the city.

Current state licensed daycares in the city, including CFCF, do have openings for new applicants in the event a home daycare decides to not register with the city, and are expecting more to open in the fall.

"In the fall, we will be completing one of our unfinished rooms in our new addition enabling us to care for an additional 15 preschool children ages 3-5 years old and another room opening for an additional seven toddler children ages 2-3 years old. We also have availability for school age children 6-10 years old," Sherlock said.
