Benefit dinner, bake sale planned for local family

There will be a spaghetti dinner and bake sale fundraiser held at Trinity Lutheran Church (816 E Clark St, Vermillion) on April 6 from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. Proceeds will benefit the family of Brayden Waterbury, infant son of USD employee, Ann Waterbury and her husband, Randall.

Brayden Waterbury, who is nine months old, was born with Congenital Heart Disease which is a problem with the heart's structure and function that is present at birth. His specific birth defect is called AV Canal and consists of two holes in his heart and a leaking mitral valve. He underwent open-heart surgery when he was only three months old to patch the holes and repair the valve. Unfortunately, the valve is in such a highpressure location of the heart that it can be very difficult to fix. Since his first surgery, Brayden's

valve repair has broken down and now leaks blood into the heart's lower chambers causing the left side of his heart to enlarge. If left untreated, Brayden will die of heart failure. He will undergo a second open-heart surgery in the next few months in an attempt to repair the mitral valve once again. Open-heart surgery is dangerous for all ages but especially for babies. Due to the complexity of this second repair, it will take place at Boston's Children's Hospital.

Heart defects are the world's most common defect and unfortunately, the leading cause of birth-defect related death. In the U.S., twice as many children die from CHD each year than all forms of childhood cancer combined. Unfortunately, the cause of CHD is still unknown.
