# Byes bring home wrestling gold

RAPID CITY – Cousins Regan and Brett Bye, both members of the Vermillion Tangers wrestling squad, each won state championships on March 1 at the Rushmore Plaza Civic Center.

They both won two matches on Friday, and two more matches on Saturday to conclude a great season.

Trey Hage was the only other Tanager to earn a medal. On Friday, he pinned Brady Krause (Milbank) in 4:50 and beat Slayton Ludens (Spearfish) in a 5-2 decision to advance to the 106-pound weight class semi-finals. On Saturday, he lost a 5-2 decision to Pierre's Austin Senger, then blanked Cody Tupper (Belle Fourche) 5-0, before losing 11-0 in the consolation championship to Jacob Puppe (Brookings) to bring home the fourth-place medal.

Regan Bye had to come from the middle of the bracket of the 145-pound weight class, having placed second at the regionals. He pinned Casey Cox (Watertown) in 2:58, then won a 3-1 decision against Tyler Ashley (Douglas) to advance to the semi-finals. It took more than the scheduled six minutes for him to beat Sioux Falls Roosevelt's Zach Determan with a 7-6 overtime decision. Determan would take home the third-place medal.

This set up a rematch with Dakota Valley's Blake Perryman in the finals. Perryman was able to defeat Bye for the Dakota XII Conference and the Region 2A championships in the last couple of weeks. Regan used these two losses as motivation to defeat the senior from North Sioux City in a 8-6 decision to become a two-time state champion, like his father and coach, Hazen.

The very next match showcased his cousin, Brett Bye, in the 152-pound championship. He started out by pinning Sean Warnock (Spearfish) in a prompt 28 seconds before scoring a 9-1 major decision against Aberdeen Central's Grayson Neuharth. Neuharth would eventually finish in sixth place. On Saturday, Brett beat Blake Stone (Rapid City Central) by a 7-2 decision in the semi-finals. Stone would finish third.

Alex Herrick from Mitchell had to take on the lad from Vermillion with the voracious appetite for victory. Brett scored a 14-4 major decision to guarantee his first-ever state championship, and he did it by going the entire season undefeated. Only one other wrestler, John Frisco of Aberdeen Central (49-0), was able to claim that distinction this year. Brett finished with a 48-0 season record.

The world has been turned on its head. When I wrestled for the Bucks decades ago, there was no way Vermillion would have a better team than Yankton, and Aberdeen Central was the perpetual doormat.

The Bucks finished in 23rd place with only 15 points, while the Tangers finished in 11th place with 75 points, just one point behind Mitchell. The Golden Eagles ran away with the team title by scoring 177.5 points, 30 points better than second place Pierre T.F. Riggs.

The Golden Eagles were able to accomplish this feat while only having one individual champion at 170 pounds (John Frisco). They scored so many points by placing wrestlers in the top eight in 12 of the 14 weight-classes, and by having six guys wrestle for championships.

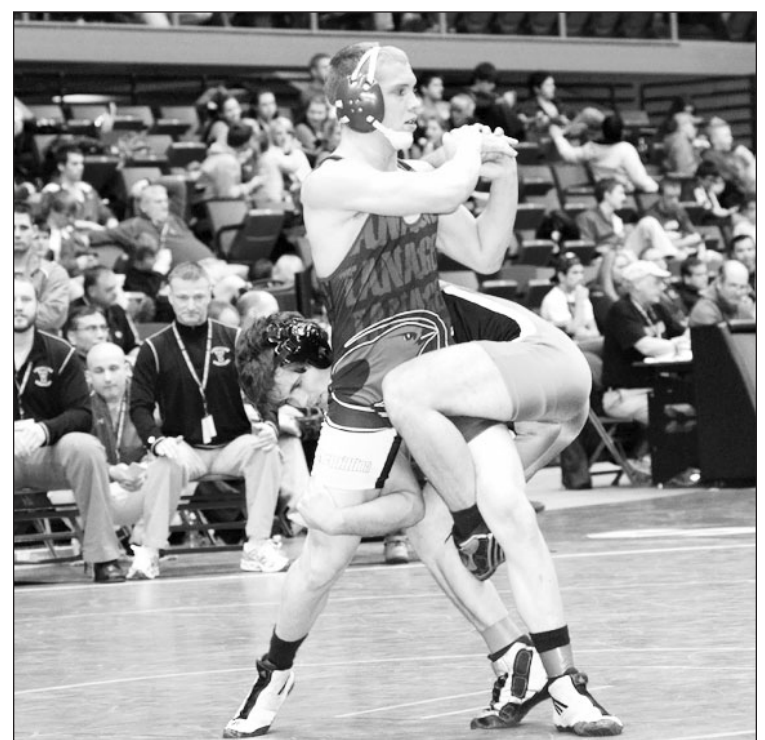
The other five Tangers contributed to the team score, even without placing. At 113-pounds, Kyle Seibel lost to Pierre's Aric William, but came back to defeat Scott Warwick of Dell Rapids. He was knocked out of the tournament when he lost to Huron's Trent Francom.

At 132-pounds, Carter Kratz started out by accepting a forfeit from Sioux Falls Roosevelt's Brock Kortan, but lost to Haden Hansen from Rapid City Central, who would finish second. In the wrestle-backs, he lost to eventual seventh-place finisher Trevor Larson of Aberdeen Central to end his tournament.

Brandon Hertz didn't score any points at 160 pounds. He lost his opening match to eventual sixth-place finisher, Matt Larson of Mitchell. He lost his wrestle-back match to Austin Eulberg of Dell Rapids.

Alex Osborne defeated Huron's Connor Gose in the opening round of the 170-pound matches. He lost to Sterling Gehrke of Watertown, then lost to Ethan Bennett of Sturgis. Gehrke would go on to defeat Bennett for fifth place.

Seth Heine pinned Cody Clark of Douglas to start out the

182-pound class. He was in turn pinned by Francis Boehmer of Sioux Falls Roosevelt, and defeated by Watertown's Triston Wirtjes. Boehmer would finish third, while Wirtjes would finish fifth.

Concluding an outstanding season, the Tangers are looking to a bright future. Many on the team will be competing in the AAU District tourney in Elk Point on March 8. We expect many of them to advance to the AAU Regions March 15 in Vermillion.

As for next year, they are looking to build on this season's

successes. The team is losing four seniors, two of which scored points at State. Alex Osborne, Seth Heine, Zech Westergaard and Dalton Marvin will be sorely missed for their leadership and their abilities.

All three State place-winners will return. Trey Hage is now a very experienced and seasoned eighth-grader. Kyle Seibel, and Carter Kratz are ninth-graders. Brandon Hertz, Regan Bye and Brett Bye are juniors. With a whole stable-full of underclassmen, Vermillion should expect great things from its wrestlers in the next few years.
