addition, any other placer who meets or beats the regular-season time, height or distance standard in any event also qualifies to be at the state meet in Madison and Sioux Falls on May 27-28.

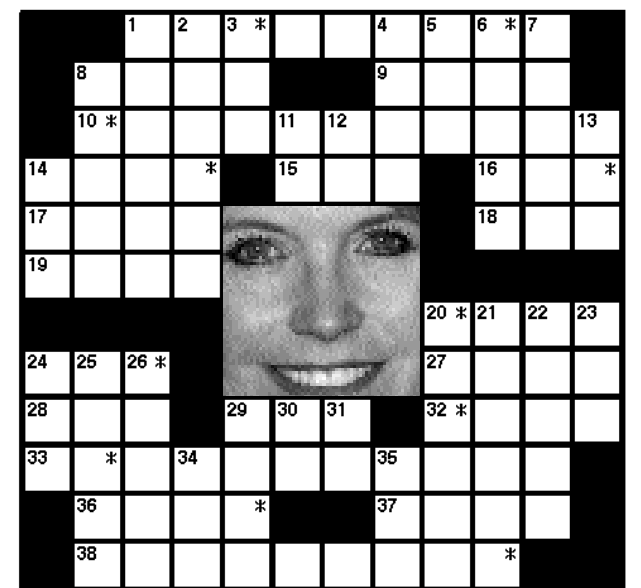

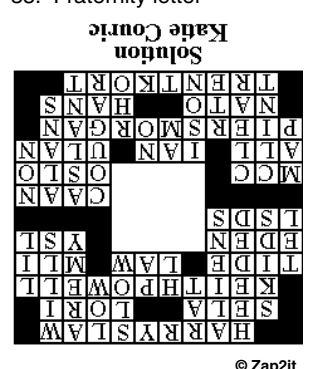
Books can be brought to the Plain Talk Office, 201 W Cherry, Vermillion.
