Beacom School of Business graduates score top 3 percent in national exam

Graduating seniors from the University of South Dakota Beacom School of Business scored in the 97th percentile in a national exam for business school graduates. In a test administered by the Educational Testing Service (ETS) of Princeton, NJ, USD scored a new institutional high, 163.9 scaled score, putting the students in the top 3 percent.

Fifteen USD students scored in the 97th to 99th percentile while an additional 19 students scored in the 90th percentile of the 124 multiplechoice exam utilized to measure basic skills and evaluate students' abilities to analyze and solve problems, understand relationships and interpret material.

Overall, 121 USD students took the ETS exam, which is administered annually by more than 400 colleges and universities in the United States. Ninety-nine of the 121 scored at the national average or above.
