Keep Vermillion Looking Beautiful

The City of Vermillion Code Enforcement Department wishes to remind you that it is the duty of the occupant or owner of any lot in the City of Vermillion to keep such lot free from tall grass, weeds and Noxious vegetation and to cut such growth whenever: 1. Grass or weeds grow taller than 6 inches on any developed lot or any lot on a block that is comprised of 50% or more developed lots

2. Grass or weeds grow taller than 12 inches on any undeveloped lot.

Exception: Portions of property used specifically for agricultural purposes, including, but not limited to, flower gardens, vegetable gardens, and the growing of crops as well as property that is unable to be mowed due to topographical or wetland features shall be exempt from divisions (1) and (2) above. No property shall be exempt from the noxious vegetation prohibition above.

Lot in violation of City ordinance will be tagged and assessed an administrative fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) for the first offense with the fee increasing by 20 dollars (\$20.00) of every additional offense with each calendar year. If all the grass and weed have not been cut in the time allowed. The City will cut the grass and or weeds and bill the property owner for the cost of mowing plus a \$25.00 service fee.
