Plain Talk receives awards in SDNA Better Newspaper Contest

The Vermillion Plain Talk has garnered six awards in the annual South Dakota Newspaper Association's Better Newspaper Contest, including first place in "Best Typography & Design." In this single category, the Plain Talk was judged among weekly newspapers in state with over 2,000

The Vermillion paper was rated among South Dakota weeklies with circulations of 1,115 to 2,000 in other contest categories.


The awards were presented at the SDNA's annual convention, held April 25-27 in Rapid City.

The Plain Talk received 350 of a total of 400 points from judges for typography and design, giving the newspaper excellent ratings for its front page design, use of illustrations and photographs, general appearance, and use of headlines.

The *Plain Talk's* website (plaintalk.net) received a perfect score and a second place rating among all weekly newspapers in South Dakota. The web page, managed by New Media Director Beth Rye and Editor David Lias, collected 200 out of a possible 200 points for its news and information content, overall design and composition, originality and interactivity with other sites. Lias' work in four categories – Best News Story, Best Local General Interest Column, Best Feature Photo and Best Photo Series, also received awards among South Dakota newspapers with circulations of 1,115 to 2,000.

been made since the program began in 1997.




