

HHS names Coffee Cup Fuel Stop as 2013 Corporate Sponsor

Employees from Coffee Cup Fuel Stop and the Heinz Corporation presented Heartland Humane Society with a \$6,981 check on Monday, April 22, naming them the shelter's 2013 corporate sponsor.

"Coffee Cup and the Heinz family have long been supporters of Heartland Humane Society," said Kerry Schmidt, Heartland Humane Society executive director. "As the shelter continues to grow we need larger donations to continue serving needy animals. One goal for this year was to establish a Corporate Sponsor and I feel we've found a great fit with Coffee Cup and the Heinz Corporation."

Three quarters of the funds are donated tips from the team employees in Caribou Coffee, Subway and Pizza Hut. Upon opening the new facilities in Coffee Cup in October 2011, the employees made the decision to save tips and donate them to a local charity.

The remainder of the gift is from Heinz Corporations. Ericka Schapekahn, Coffee Cup director of human



resources and special projects, said Heartland Humane Society was a perfect match for the gift.

"This is a large donation for a small shelter like Heartland and our staff felt it was important to reach out to a local group structuring itself to

grow and serve its community," Schapekahn said. "In addition, the Heinz family and our employees are big animal supporters and selecting Heartland as the recipient felt like a perfect match."

The corporation sponsorship

will allow the shelter to promote animals awaiting adoption at new events in 2013. The shelter predicts over 325 animals will enter the facility this year.

which provided about 16 days of landfill life," he said. "If we take it up to 6.6 pounds a day, that'll be six more days per year that would be saved in landfill life."

The other option – Option 3 – also is single-stream but would garner less revenue, and because the Joint Powers would have less control of the materials they could get rid of.

"We'll have an increase in materials to be marketed by going to single-stream. We'll have an increase of \$87,725 for Option 2. Option 3, you'll have the loss revenue, so that comes in at a loss," Iverson said.

Either way, rates would increase, with Option 2 costing \$1.41 and Option 3 costing \$3.30 in addition to what is already charged, Iverson said.

Although most of the council members spoke in favor of Option 2, no action was taken.

Two faculty members retiring from University of SD School of Law

Two faculty members, Randall J. Gingiss and Michael J. Myers, are retiring from the University of South Dakota School of Law this month after several years of service, scholarship and research.

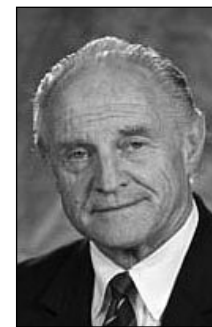
"I salute Randy and Mike for their accomplishments and long service to the state and region and wish them the best in the next phase of their life interests," said Tom Geu, interim law dean.

Gingiss is retiring after 17 years. His courses have included trusts and wills, estate planning, and estate and gift administration. He also served on many committees and as faculty advisor to student groups. He received a B.A. in economics at Amherst College; a J.D. from the University of Michigan; an LL.M degree

at DePaul University; and, an M.B.A. at the University of Chicago. He was a trust officer and practiced estate planning law for more than 20 years before joining the USD Law faculty.

Myers taught for 27 years at USD School of Law, including courses on health care law and elder law. He also created a senior legal helpline, radio forum (Myers recorded his 500th show in September 2012), and weekly newspaper column through which he provides pro

bono information and advice to persons 55 and older. Myers received a B.S. from South Dakota State University and a J.D. from USD School of Law. He taught at USD School of Law from 1969 to 1972 and 1990 to 2013. From 1976 to 1989, Myers worked in health care administration in Farmington Hills, MI, Sioux City, IA, and he was a CEO for Mayo-St. Mary's Hospital in Rochester, MN.

SD increases bandwidth to over 150 schools

In partnership with the South Dakota Department of Education (DOE), the South Dakota Bureau of Information and Telecommunications (BIT) will work throughout the summer to increase bandwidth to 159 school sites across the state, impacting 122 school districts.

"We continue to see a trend of K-12 bandwidth doubling every 2-3 years. This increase in service corresponds directly with that trend," stated Pat Snow telecommunications manager. "We are proud to assist with this project upgrade as this is a great improvement; allowing educators to continue enhancing educational services through the Internet."

The bare minimum of Internet bandwidth is 10 Mbps, or megabits per second. Funding was approved and appropriated to DOE this past

legislative session to increase the bandwidth minimum to 50 Mbps where available across the state. The upgrade allows for additional capacity to provide education-related services via the Internet; through online applications and assessments, distance learning and allows schools to do so without delay.

The project is currently in its implementation phase and is expected to be completed prior to the 2013-2014 school year.

"In today's classrooms, teachers incorporate technology on a daily basis as part of the learning process, and they need to be confident that the technology will work," concluded Secretary of Education Melody Schopp. "This bandwidth initiative will help to ensure that we have the infrastructure in place to support learning."

Sequestration reduces unemployment benefits

South Dakota will be reducing extended unemployment compensation (EUC) benefits by 16.8 percent as part of the federal sequestration cuts required by the Budget Control Act of 2011.

This reduction does not impact the 26 weeks of state unemployment benefits. It does affect all claimants filing for EUC benefits beginning the week of June 2, and ending the week of Sept. 28, approximately 275 claimants.

"Individuals will still be eligible for up to 14 weeks of extended benefits," said State Labor and Regulation Secretary Pam Roberts.

"However, it will be a reduced benefit amount for those extended weeks."

A notice of the upcoming reduction will be mailed to all claimants who have an active EUC claim as of May 13. Amended monetary determinations will be sent the first week of June.

Unemployment insurance provides temporary financial assistance for people who have lost their jobs, through no fault of their own, until they find other employment. South Dakota's unemployment insurance program is financed by employers through payroll taxes. Workers do not contribute to this plan.
